

Within the Word - Beholding God

Every Sunday we enter into Christ's redemption; His passion, Crucifixion and Resurrection have been memorialized forever – It all comes together at Mass. Not just a remembrance but the actual moment –the very same time and place. When the Priest holds up the consecrated body and blood, he issues a hearty proclamation, "Behold the Lamb of God, Behold Him who takes away the Sins of the world."

Folks more than anything we need to listen embrace these words at mass. Remembering the how, what and who we are with Christ and His sacrifice, is what we remember. The redemptive act of God's son should never be overlooked or forgotten; how sad is it when I see people sleeping or even talking during the consecration of the Eucharist – forgive me, but like John, I'm also saying the same words, "Behold the Lamb of God, Behold Him who takes away the Sins of the world."

Christ's redemption should be beholden.

Here's a thought. Would you ever forget a tragedy about a young person losing their life, of course not; your family and friends, even an entire community would never forget a tragedy like that, even for years to come. They might set up a memorial or even host an annual charity. The point is we remember tragic deaths, even decades after. So how come we are sometimes indifferent when the priest proclaims, "Behold the Lamb of God..." Beholding Jesus is not just something we do; it's something we receive into our very being. It's not something we say and forget about...It involves remembering what your life would be without Him. So, remember these words at mass. Remember why the Church prays it and remember when the priest holds up the Body and Blood proclaiming. It's your redemption too, I hope and pray we as Christians never take it for granted.

Pope Francis has said that respect for life is not just about the unborn child in the womb, but also about the least of our brothers and sisters. Yes, it is even upon the undocumented resident alien who has no voice but ours. As followers of Jesus Christ, we are all called to protect the voiceless. Let us pray...

Good and gracious God, you blew into our nostrils the breath of life. You are the One to whom we owe our very existence.
