# Within the Word – Salt of the Earth

Friends, what is the salt of the Earth? Simply put it is the "good stuff," that which is the best that comes from the Earth –the stuff we value and cherish the most. It is our humanity at best. In the literal sense, salt gives flavor to what is bland and boring, and lifts it into something interesting. In the same way a new baby blesses and brings a family together, a visit from an old friend banishes dullness, or a leader gives a sense of purpose to a community. So it's safe to say, being 'Salt of the Earth' is a good thing.

We must be careful though, not to lose the "good stuff" in our spiritual lives; for we can lose the saltiness, the goodness inside –by self -indulgence, sin or being self-centered. Worldly riches don't help either; via power and honor which are highly valued in the world. But Jesus draws on things from the light and the Earth, to teach us deeper values. Just as salt preserves food and keeps it good, so does light.

Light keeps us out of the dark. With Christ we as Christians are the "light of the world." (Helping others get out of the darkness) Interestingly enough <u>light does not change a room</u>: it simply enables us to see what's in it. Light helps us appreciate what is good and beautiful, just as it helps us avoid tripping or falling into pitfalls. Being in the Light is both physical and spiritual. As Christians, we are children of the light –because we're illumined by Christ. And we go out on His behalf to share His light. This reality (divine or not) helps us see everything; from physical and spiritual darkness to the heavenly illuminations that come from the Sacraments. The light of Christ reveals the hidden...and brings the Truth and Hope that is in us. Think about these things and how we can share Christ's light an help illumine someone's heart and mind. That's when you truly are the Salt of the Earth and a Light to the World...
