



Within the Word – Fulfilling the Law

The scripture passage of Sunday is challenging and though provoking. Even Scholars have difficulty reconciling Jesus' words here with His freedom of spirit, in matters concerning the Sabbath. In short, Jesus did not reject the Old Testament of the Jews, (He too was a Jew) but He did try to bring it back to the basics; that being, love God and love your neighbor as yourself. Jesus also stresses that our life should be of one heart and mind, (not a divided heart or mind) so that people should be able to read our values from our behavior – that is more important than being able to instruct people in the law of God. As my homiletics professor once said, "It is more difficult to live out a homily, than to preach a dozen."

Lastly, Christ came to fulfill the law. For Jesus, simply observing the external laws was not enough. Jesus wants us to listen and have courageous, generous hearts like His –to follow the law with love. That is how Jesus' words make sense, for Jesus lived out the Torah (the Law) in love. Jesus modeled and expressed the love-relationship between God and the Jewish People. He did this by revealing His Love through His sacrifice and Passion. We too are called to fulfill that sacred relationship in our lives. We took are asked to listen and obey. It is through obedience and sacrifice that we learn to Love and know God; (as much as one can) for our lives are not just about us, but of Him as well. That is the first step in fulfilling the law.
