

Within the Word – Transformed during Lent

This 2nd Sunday of Lent, the Church shares the story of Abraham, and how he was promised a great nation. The story of Abraham reminds us of the deepest truths of our faith -that God will always provide and He'll never abandon us. This Sunday we read about that promise and are reminded of the Glory that awaits us the Transfiguration.

So what do we make of this connection? I'd argue first that it's a story about faith and how God rewards those who trust in Him. Abraham's story offers a vivid display of that trust, especially when he's asked to sacrifice his son. In short, when it comes to God and His grace; the more you give, the more you will receive. It's called the law of gift. This law teaches us that the more you give yourself away, the more you will increase, and vice versa the more you cling to yourself the more you will decrease. This sounds a lot like a paradox, and well because it is.

How terribly confusing it must have been for Abraham to be asked to sacrifice His son, especially with his faith in the Lord. Yet, remember the end result. Abraham tells his son, after Isaac asks, "what are we going to sacrifice?" Abraham assures him that God will provide. And what was the end result –the Covenant.

When the first Christians heard the story of the transfiguration, they probably found a great resemblance between the story of Abraham and the events of Jesus' sacrifice. In the account of the Transfiguration, we hear of the Father saying, 'This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him.'" The similarity of Isaac and Jesus is not accidental. For Christ, God the Father will lay a Cross upon His shoulder and lead him up to die on Calvary; as Abram led Isaac up the mountain. The result was the law of gift. When Jesus offered Himself as a gift, He brought back for us the gift of eternal life.

Folks, remember during the Second week of Lent, that God can be trusted! God can be relied upon. He's God. He LOVES us! He's leading us on a path that makes no sense at all, but with Faith makes all the sense in the world. God is at the helm, it's Ok. Yes, at times we're scared and don't know what to do, but like Peter at the Transfiguration all we need to do is listen to Him.




