





Within the Word – True Living Water

The third week of lent brings us to the woman at the well. How often do we find ourselves like the woman –ashamed, feeling crestfallen by a people or community? Sometimes we feel people judging us for our misfortunes, our life's choices or behaviors. This only leads to division and segregation. And for obvious reasons, we tend to stay away from places that pass judgment, especially if it's in church or a community that should be accepting and forgiving.

The woman at the well is that figure. She is a non-Jew gathering water at noon, and she meets Jesus. What does Jesus do? He talks to her, He asks her to give him a drink, and continues to talk with her about passing things. Jesus is a man speaking publically to a woman. (Something you just didn't do) Among many things, Jesus teaches us how to be with those who might feel shame or be humiliation; we are to talk to them.

We don't know her name, we don't know her age, and yet her conversation with Jesus is of great length; one of the longest in the Gospels. What's fascinating is her response to the Christ. She displays attitude and drama, you can imagine that she's a bit spirited and sarcastic —and to Jesus of all people. It was high noon on a hot day and Jesus was tired from traveling. He chose a sensible place to rest, while his disciples went to town for food. He began with a very deep question, one that can have many meanings, "Give me a drink."

Now there are taboos all over the place. First, Jews don't speak to Samaritans. (Long story) Second, men were not permitted to address ladies without their husband or fathers present. Thirdly rabbis had no business speaking to women, (cultural thing) especially at midday. Those who came at noon were often people too ashamed to come in the morning (when it was cool). What we have here is Jesus being rebellious. Again, we see that He's willing to toss out rules, norms and reach out to those in need; and right from the start we get her liveliness and spunk. "You are a Jew and I am a Samaritan woman," she reminded him. "How can you ask me for a drink?"

As she's reminding him of the law and cultural norms, Jesus focuses on grace and mercy and offers something nobody could refuse. He offers the gift of Living water, which only comes from God. Instead of insisting she pour him a drink, the Lord offers her "living water." Water from the ground was common, but living water? That was something very different. This gutsy woman pointed out the obvious: "You have nothing to draw with and the well is deep. Where can you get this living water?" Her curiosity prompts her to ask and Jesus gives a very big answer. He says, "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again. But, whoever drinks the water I give will never thirst," Here Jesus shifts her mind from the things of the world to the things of God; from everyday life to life everlasting.

Folks, I invite you to read the rest of the story, and find your Bibles and read the whole 4th chapter of John. When you do you will find that Jesus is conversing with the woman at the well because He has something to offer, something that lasts. More often than not we're more concerned with the things of this world and not the things of the God. Jesus is offering eternal life every time we come to mass. The Eucharist that nourishes and the Word that heals are the two sources of Jesus' life giving water. He gives it so freely. Ask yourselves, do we receive them worthily? Do we truly believe? Read Ch. 4 in Johns Gospel and find out for yourself. Ask yourself, would you give Jesus a drink?


