

Within the Word – The Most Precious

My dear brothers and sisters, this Sunday we celebrate the Precious Body and Blood of Our Lord Jesus Christ, the source and summit of our life as the Church. In the Eucharist, the bread and wine are transformed, by the Spirit of God into the Body and Blood of Christ; the sacrament we receive is God. When you think of the reality of that, we should be in awe; because we eat God's Body and Drink His blood...What does that make us? Divine...

St. Augustine preached, "If you have received worthily, you become what you have received." In short, in sharing in the body of Christ we become the body of Christ. And as much as we believe this, we don't always know or live it. Oftentimes we take for granted and forget this very big 'reality.' We are part of God, completely through His Son. We are God's Children?! We have divine life in us and participate in it over and over again every Sunday. We're not some extension of some king of England's king, we're not part of the royal family of Ghana, no we're God's children. How can we compare anything to that?

In offering Himself to God through the Spirit, Jesus delivered Israel from the transgressions of the first covenant, and we too are of the New Covenant –by His blood He purified us & made us capable of "True" worship. We now have the means to worship god in True Worship. Until Christ died & offered Himself, we didn't have anything to offer in this sense.

Brothers and sisters, God doesn't want dead works, cereal offerings or animal sacrifices. He wants good works; our own lives consecrated to Him are just that; so in turn we can offer sacrifices worthily. (That's why Christ IS the only sacrifice worth offering) This is the power of our worship and the true sacrifice of the Catholic Faith. It is in thanksgiving we offer, time and time again each Sunday. This is Our Faith, all from the Eucharist.

Remember when we receive this most precious Body and Blood, that is what we do in memory of Him. Remember we pledge our lives to God in receiving the Eucharist, and 'be to others' what He is to us. There is no return we can offer for this inheritance. Christ has won it for us. Remember in accepting this gift we should spread it to others. Let us approach the altar this weekend and every weekend, remembering the eternal life we have in Christ, for without it we the Church would surely die. God bless you on the Solemnity of the Most Precious Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ

St. Mary's Confirmation!


