Within the Word - Get behind me Satan!

In this incident, Peter becomes Satan the tempter. Wow, talk about falling from grace....Just as Satan tried to persuade Jesus to take the easy way out (turn stones into bread), so now Peter calls Jesus to abandon the narrow and deadly road that leads to the cross; even after Jesus teaches that the wide easy road leads to destruction. "You are a stumbling block to me." He says. The idea of a stumbling stone was particularly vivid in this culture & generation, where there was no blacktop or flat concrete, in short the land was rocky. People would often experience stumbling over a stone or two; for people walked almost everywhere and everyday. At best, the person who stumbled would suffer a sore toe or knee. At worst, he would stumble in the

midst of a battle & be rendered helpless in the face of his enemy. Jesus sees Peter's intervention as a spiritual stumbling block—something that has the potential to cause Jesus to stumble on His journey to Jerusalem. Hence, Jesus scolds Peter. For Jesus cannot ignore a threat of this significance. He must put Peter firmly in his place, by saying "for you are not setting your mind on the things of God, but



on the things of men." Of course, this isn't the way Peter sees it. Peter understands that Jesus is the messiah, & is simply trying to keep him from harm. By not spoiling the plans they had made along the way. Peter wants the messiah to succeed. How can that be bad? Well, the answer is that Peter's vision of the mission is skewed, & he's trying to superimpose his vision over God's. Here's the lesson. Share with God your plans in life, & He might agree or laugh at you. Either way, His way's are best.
