Growing sweet corn is hard...I hate to admit it but earlier this year I wanted to experience raising a small crop of corn. I had ambitions to start a 'small' garden style, above ground 'crop of corn.' I know, this already sounds weird. And boy was I in for a learning curve. My hope was to plant a few varieties of sweet corn, watch them grow, study and observe; and discover which type was the biggest, sweetest, and what grew the fastest. These were things I had in mind. I spent some of my stimulus money, buying and building 'raised beds,' (most in 5 gallon buckets, & no they didn't work) with the hope that I'd experience what some

gardeners and farmers do; as Tim M. sang, "watching them corn pop in rows." Surprisingly, I had learned a lot, especially the fact that growing corn isn't as easy as it looks. Its difficult. Matter of fact, from the 70 plus seedlings I grew and raised, most of them didn't' get past 4 feet, several grew 6' plus, all but one stalk produced two cobs of corn –which weren't very impressive. So I grew 2 shabby cobs of corn, from one stalk, and ironically from the one that miraculously grew inside Mary's Garden. So who knows...Among other things, It is undeniable, that I do not have a green thumb...I have a black thumb. Hence, why I stick with motors, Harleys and Mopars; I am a grease monkey through and through...Also, I think Mary was trying to tell me something, and that is, I should leave the corn growing to the farmers in town. In short, I thought to give it a try, but I've learned (and now understand) that growing corn is hard. Don't bother growing sweet corn in 5 gallon buckets with Miracle grow...It will grow fast & tall, & then stall and wilt; because it can't hold the moisture. It's why none of my efforts payed off, and I failed to produce any corn/cobs. I've learned an expensive lesson...& that being... '*Keep it the ground*,' as my buddy Jim tells me -you were right Jim!

Folks, this Sunday's parable is about God's Mercy, which is one of the greatest divine attributes we've access too; it is one of the many universal truths. God is all powerful, God is all knowing, He is all merciful...In life, nothing but pure mercy, out of compassion can cancel out a debt like deep sin; like the one referred to in this story. Just look at how powerful it is for a person to receive a pardon.? Google Alice Marie Johnson story. A woman sentenced for life, without parole for drug trafficking and fraud. Now these are very serious federal offenses, be she didn't directly commit any of them. She was an accessory. A bit extreme? life without parole? Another example is the Cross; how God dying on the cross in such a way, canceled out all our sins. We need to be reconciled, yes, we need absolution & the process of getting rid of sins, but Jesus' death on the cross is our mercy.

Jesus words further call us to be merciful to others as we've received mercy. Divine Mercy is so much deeper than general forgiveness; it sees deep into the heart of the other, and embraces them. To end, Peter has a problem with forgiveness, (to Jews, you weren't expected to grant mercy) as Jesus makes a generous suggestion of forgiving a person seven times, only to be astounding with Christ's response to forgive a person seventy-seven times seven. (Meaning infinitely) Try it, you might find it most liberating & a joy filled thing to do...
