Within the Word - Eternity is as long as a Day

Friends, for God who is outside of time and space, eternity is hard to understand. St. Paul writes, "a day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like a day... These are strange things to understand. How can this be? We know what a day feels like; history has record and science teaches us that a thousand years equals -365000

days! But for God it's just a moment. When I hear these words, I take comfort in that what we understand as time, is not the same in the realms of Heaven. For outside of space and time, God Is. His realms of heaven and hell and everything in between are outside of the sciences we understand. There are no physical sciences within these places; they are outside our own universe, & so we need a different approach to how we understand them -hence they are mysteries. All of this requires Faith & humility, grounded in Hope & Joy of what is to come...which is



being with God & His Kingdom for eternity. I invite you to ponder these things on the 2nd week of Advent; where we dive into the virtue of Hope. Hope means everything to our faith! We need hope or else faith is meaningless. What would faith be if we didn't have anything to hope for? -complete despair & emptiness...Moreover, I invite you to reflect on time and eternity during Advent. What will the next day bring? Well, as St. Paul writes, "It's a thousand years for those in Heaven." Also, ask yourselves, where will your eternity be? For me, I'd rather live a lifetime of struggling in the faith, each day in hopes to get to Heaven, then fall into the depths of hopelessness & despair not caring I'd fall into Hell for all eternity. These are things I think about; I invite you this Advent to do the same.



Fr. Clayton's Health Update -Friends, it's not good. I'm sad to share that I've been diagnosed with another symptom from my accident; what the doctors have called a severe case of, post-concussion syndrome. I'm already in week 2 of physical therapy and rehabilitation. My doctors & nurses have told me, it's as serious as it gets for someone who has severe brain trauma. To some this might be a surprise, as I've been masking these things for 3 weeks; they manifested themselves about the 2nd week of November, about a month after my accident, and about the time these things manifest. Because my injuries have developed into post-concussion syndrome, things are very $\tilde{\tilde{u}}$ difficult for me. My brain is in a stage of neuroplasticity, & could be healing in the wrong direction. If not taken care of the right way, these symptoms & syndrome could be permanent. It will take many months of rehabilitation to fully recover if at all. I am having a very difficult time accepting this as it has most likely ended my military career. Many have shared they want me to stay, but it was a lifelong dream of mine to become an officer in the United States Air Force. Now, I'm struggling to protect & preserve my priestly vocation.


Also, I must share, as I feel it's time, that I experienced a head on collision with a 40ft RV, of which pulled out in front of me. I T-boned the back end of the RV, flipped it over, where it then slide 50+ feet. It then started on fire. I was driving about 55-60 mph. The driver didn't see me, & he attempted to make an illegal U-turn. He pulled out in front, & I simply had no time to brake. All I could do was choose where to hit. I swerved to the back of the RV, closed my eyes, tried to relax & said "I Trust in You;" the impact was so great, the front end of the vehicle was crushed inward over 12 in...

Folks, there is so much more that happened that day, I am unable to relive this experience, and ask not to feel bad or inquire about it. Even now I am struggling to keep myself together as I write this. Rev's spleen almost ruptured, Lily was traumatized and I was in another place. I am thankful for life, for my vocation & a second chance. The 80-year-couple are fine, but most certainty would've been gravely injured. For myself, It should've been anything but what I incurred. I am eternally grateful that I am alive and walking. I could easily be in the hospital in a coma. I am asked to take medical leave, as any exposure to stress can have a reverse affect to the progress I've

made. I feel absolutely stupid for not taking this accident more serious, as the trauma, (although it seemed minor & I felt fine) has had major consequences. In truth I was in denial & I blanked everything out, in fear of losing a future commission, as well as being unable to adjust my work environment -up & leaving

seamed out of the question. Please pray for me as I discern what is best moving forward. It's very difficult to think about what's best for my health as well as the parish. Pray that the bishop and vicar can help discuss the same, and please pray for



my vocation. If my recovery and rehabilitation is not successful, or is delayed, (for even celebrating mass is very difficult) I will have to take a leave of absence. Please pray the rosary, pray to St. Philomena, Mary and Joseph, and the Holy Family, please offer mass wherever you can for my wellbeing. -God bless
