

# A Note From Fr. John:

Doctoring and ordering new glasses has given me another perspective. I have had my current pair of glasses for years. Getting a new pair and new prescription will change things. Change is one of those words that people don't generally like. Change can mean so many different things. If it benefits us, change is a good thing and if not we don't like it, it is not a good thing. When my new pair comes in I will have to learn and adjust to them. Again greater effort for something we already do is not something we want to do either.

Being a patient and having the doctor go over things with me also requires change. Having others tell us what to do is usually not a favorite of many people. That calls for trust even when we don't see the immediate impact.

There have been a number of changes here at St. Mary's parish the last number of months. Change can be unsettling. Often we like black and white, the rules of the game, to guide us. Questions have arisen and some have been asked of the rectory office and the councils, which is a good place to go for answers. If there are worries or concerns please bring them forward. Some things can be quick and easy and others may take some time to address.

Having an administrator is a good thing, not as good as having a pastor of course. This is a sign of encouragement. The diocese is working on finding a pastor. The Bishop would like St. Mary to be a free standing parish with its own pastor. You as a parish are in good financial shape and able to handle a pastor by yourself. Some smaller parishes can't do that.

As a smaller parish finances can be tight. By default there are less people. We have a great group that has volunteered and served in many capacities. Here I would like to challenge you to join them, to step up to the plate and offer your time and talent. Like many parishes, some have done things for many years and they are getting to the point of needing to step down for a number of reasons. Keeping St. Mary a strong parish requires parishioners to step forward.

I am grateful for those on the councils and committees. I am most appreciative of the catechists who came forward so that we can offer a religious education program for our children. I am looking forward to events in the future, but they too will need volunteers to make it happen.

We need to look again, gain another perspective, even when it is uncomfortable and trust that the Holy Spirit is at work. Jesus said that the Holy Spirit blows where it wills. Praying for our parish is so important. So is putting our God given talents to work in the vineyard of St. Mary. There is much hope here and much to look forward to. Questions are a good thing; gossip and negativity do not spread the Gospel. Be patient with one another and this time of growth and transition. The Bishop desires St. Mary Parish to grow and be around for years to come. Yes things will be different and change will happen, knowing we are all people, we are not perfect and need to work together calls forth living out the virtues and the Gospel commandments of love of God and neighbor from each of us. Let us see the good that God is accomplishing right in our midst.


