This season of Advent, of conversion and preparation, of waiting for the coming of the Messiah, is a full one. We began the month with the arrival of Fr. Cryton. He is settling in and this weekend celebrating with us here at St. Mary. Please stop and say "Hi" after Mass.

This past Monday was the feast day of St. Nicholas. What a great story of faith and witness. He was a martyr of the early church. Coke may have given us the image of what we think of when we think of Santa Claus, but the red is for the shedding of his blood.

This past Wednesday was our patronal feast day; the Immaculate Conception. Mary was conceived without the stain of Original Sin and was kept sinless her whole life. What a great gift that Jesus gave her. She had total freedom to say "Yes" to the Archangel.

Perhaps there are things that keep us from that freedom to say "Yes" to what God asks of us. We can be very focused on ourselves or our plans in our very busy lives. That is where the gift of the sacrament of Reconciliation comes into play for all of us. That gift is not one we will find under a tree but was won for us on the tree of the Cross.

So as a reminder confessions are heard at St. Mary's on Tuesdays from 5 pm till Mass at 5:30. (You could receive two sacraments in one day!) Also on Saturdays at 6 pm until Mass. Those two times happen every week, so God's mercy is always there for us.

In this season of Advent there will be additional time for confessions:

December 18th from 11:30 to 1:30 pm.

## December 21st from 4:30 pm until Mass that evening.

Nothing like last minute shopping, I mean confessing, to get ready for the celebration of Christmas.

Our readings focus us on Joy, a gift of the Holy Spirit. The people ask St. John the Baptist, "what should we do?" Always a good question to ask, especially of Jesus in our daily lives. Is what we are doing bringing us joy? Which is different from happiness or satisfaction. The Rose candle and vestments are that outside manifestation and reminder of the joy we are to have in our lives. Advent is a time of preparation to receive the source of joy, Jesus. So in these remaining weeks, where is our joy or what do we need to change to live joyfully? To freely say "yes" to all the good that Jesus has planned for us because of His birth, death and resurrection.
