





A Note From Fr. John

Happy May Day! Normally this is a feast of St. Joseph but as it falls on a Sunday, that solemnity takes precedence over a feast day. Nonetheless don't forget about St. Joseph and the role he played in salvation history. St. Joseph as a worker was also highlighted by the Church over and against atheistic communism who used this day to consider only the worker of this world. That is a trap any of us can get caught in; focussing only on this world and what is immediately in front of us. Being busy we can leave the spiritual out of what we are doing or figure we will get to that, yet we run out of time. Such a day is an encouragement to consider the social teaching of the Church developed by Pope Leo XIII and written out of experience by St. Pope John Paul II.

At St. Patrick's parish, on May 1, we will celebrate First Communion. We have a nice large class so celebrating with an extra Mass makes sense this year. Unfortunately for St. Mary's parish there will not be a Mass for First Communion. Pray for next year's class.

Later Sunday evening a number of priests from the diocese will gather in Oconomowoc for the annual spring retreat. So I will be gone all week. Fr. Cryton will handle everything wonderfully and I am sure we will not miss a beat. He has graciously agreed to take a retreat in late June. The Church knows human nature and requires a retreat each year for the priests to focus on prayer, spiritual growth and rest. It is too easy to say I will get to that later or who needs it and everything is fine. That is the point of the day of rest each Sunday. So do we rest or fit in what we couldn't during the week? God is serious about rest and being renewed. Are we?

Consider the following from That Man Is You.

"Eat dinner with your family at least five nights a week.

'Day by day, attending the temple together and breaking bread in their homes, they partook of food with glad and generous hearts, praising God and having favor with all the people.' (Acts 2:46-47)

Food and the dinner table are still absolutely critical in building community. When we eat food, our bodies release oxytocin...It is the hormone that helps bind us to another person. When we share a meal with someone else, the food triggers the release of oxytocin, which helps to form a bond with our dining companions. As such, it is not surprising to learn that families who eat together on a regular basis spend more time together and report fewer arguments, less tension and better relationships."

As a parish family that is a great encouragement for us to gather every Sunday to share the meal of the Body and Blood of Jesus. Our journey of faith is not one we are to do alone. Pray about the ways you and all of us can build up the Body of Christ here at the parish.

This coming week keep all the priests in your prayers and pray for vocations. St. Joseph, pray for us!
