

The Pentecost – A New Beginning

Today we are celebrating the Solemnity of Pentecost. Another great day and we begin the second part of the Ordinary time in the Liturgical year as well. The word Pentecost literally means "Fiftieth," because it was celebrated fifty days after the Feast of the Passover. It was originally a day of thanksgiving to God for the completion of good harvest in the Old Testament.

Today both the Jews and the Christians celebrate Pentecost. But for the Christians it is a memorial of the day the Holy Spirit descended on the apostles and the Virgin Mary in the form of fiery tongues – an event that took place fifty days after the resurrection of Jesus. It is therefore the official birthday of the Church. **There are three basic elements marking the event**. All these three elements are rich in symbolic meaning.

First, the sound of a mighty wind: In Hebrew as in Greek, "wind" is a synonym of "spirit". It also means "breath". In the Bible a strong wind announces the presence of God. It is the sign of theophany.

The second element of the Pentecost event is fire: Divided tongues as of fire appeared among them. Fire is always present in the manifestations of God in the Old Testament. We see this in the covenant between God and Abraham. The memory of the special manifestation of God in the form of fire was alive in the soul of Israel.

The third element is, charism of speaking in other tongues: The words that come from the Holy Spirit are like fire. In this we see Holy Spirit is giving himself to people, produces in them an effect which is both real and symbolic.

This feast also takes us to the language of the heart. A child may not know the spoken language but surely feel and experience the language of love. That could be expressed in many ways, where there is love, smile exists for ever. Wherever there is love miracle happen. Wherever there is love, hatred ends. Wherever there is love, peace begins. Wherever there is love the community transforms. Wherever there is love the society develops. Because God is Love and the spirit of God is descended on us to be the witnesses to Jesus, the greatest lover towards the humanity.

How does the Spirit work in us?

- ❖ By constantly remembering and appreciating his Holy Presence within us, especially through the sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation.
- ❖ By fortifying ourselves, with the help of the Spirit, against all types of temptations.
- ❖ By seeking the assistance of the Spirit in our thoughts, words, and deeds; and in breaking our evil habits.
- ❖ By listening to the voice of the Holy Spirit speaking to us through the Bible and through the good counsel of others.
- ❖ By fervently praying for the gifts, fruits and charism of the Holy Spirit.
- ❖ By renewing our lives through the anointing of the Holy Spirit.

Life in the Holy Spirit is a life of commitment, sacrifice and joy. It is a call to love as Jesus loved, not counting the cost. As Saint Paul exhorts us,

"Walk by the Spirit and do not gratify the desires of the flesh. If we live by the Spirit, let us also walk by the Spirit" (Galatians 5:16, 25).




