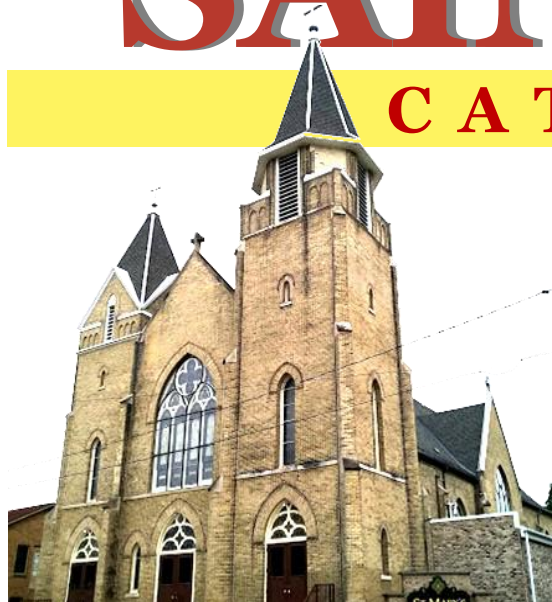

A Note from Fr. John

June is the month of the Sacred Heart, a wonderful devotion that deepens our love for the Lord who loved us to death. It was out of love that Jesus gave us His body and blood. To help us reflect on this reality I offer you the following from "A Eucharistic Jubilee" by the USCCB.

"Jesus' words. "Take this and eat it," are connected with the invocation of the human heart that needs to satiate the many kinds of hunger that mark the earthly pilgrimage: hunger for food and the essential things for life, hunger for justice and freedom, hunger for love and hope. In the bread and wine, God gives people not only the food that nourishes them but also the sacrament that renews them so that they will never be lacking in this sustenance for the body and the soul. The prayer that we direct to our heavenly Father, "Give us this day our daily bread," finds its full response in the divine Word and in the Eucharist. To us today, just like the people who asked Jesus, "Sir, give us that bread always"--He answers, "I am the bread of life. He who comes to me will never be hungry; he who believes in me will never thirst" (John 6:34-35).

To nourish oneself with Christ at the holy altar is to recognize that "as we eat His body which He gave for us, we grow in strength, and to experience the truth of his promise, "Come to me, all you who labor and are overburdened, and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28). Therefore, the power of the consecrated bread and wine invites us to return with perseverance to eat and drink at the Eucharistic banquet in order to regain the strength to progress along the way toward definitive communion with God.

Faith, nourished by the 'bread of life' and the 'chalice of salvation,' does not cease to reaffirm that Jesus is the real response that puts an end to our search for the meaning of life and its future: 'anyone who does eat my flesh and drink my blood has eternal life and I shall raise him up on the last day... anyone who eats this bread will live forever' (John 6:54, 58) Especially at times when suffering raises questions that require a response of love, everyone should realize that Christ's words, 'Take this and eat it,' are directed precisely at them. The Eucharistic bread is the strength of the weak, the support of the sick, the balm that heals wounds, and the viaticum for those leaving this world."

June as a time to reflect on the gift of the Holy Eucharist is time well spent in preparation to receive all the graces that Jesus wants to give us each time we come to Mass. We can pray anywhere but only at Mass can we receive the bread of life. It is His life that we are called to live and it can be hard without His help. So often we want to do things on our own and when it is not working out, then pray or ask God "Why?"

We will have some time to reflect and adore the Lord on the feast of Corpus Christi. At St. Mary there will be a procession around the inside of the church and benediction. At St. Patrick there will be a procession down to Riverside Park, adoration until 2 pm which will end with benediction. Feel free to come for any part of it and spend some time with Jesus. For the servers at St. Patrick we will be bringing the patens back into service as a reminder that each fragment contains the fullness of Jesus and the attention we need to welcome Him fully into our hearts. As we began, it is the heart that longs for Jesus and His Sacred Heart that longs for us.
