# We are called to be Participatory Church

The fourteenth Sunday of the ordinary time invites us to reflect on the theme of our involvement in the mission that has been entrusted to us through our Baptism. Gospel of today tells us that Jesus sends seventy two disciples for a special task. We too are called to take part in the mission that demands today.




