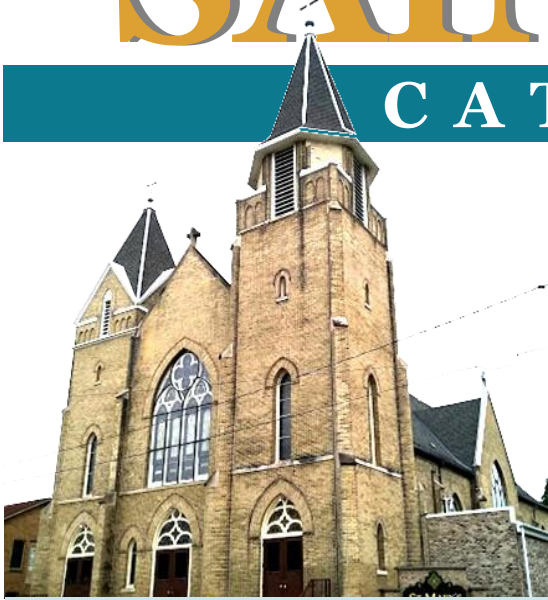

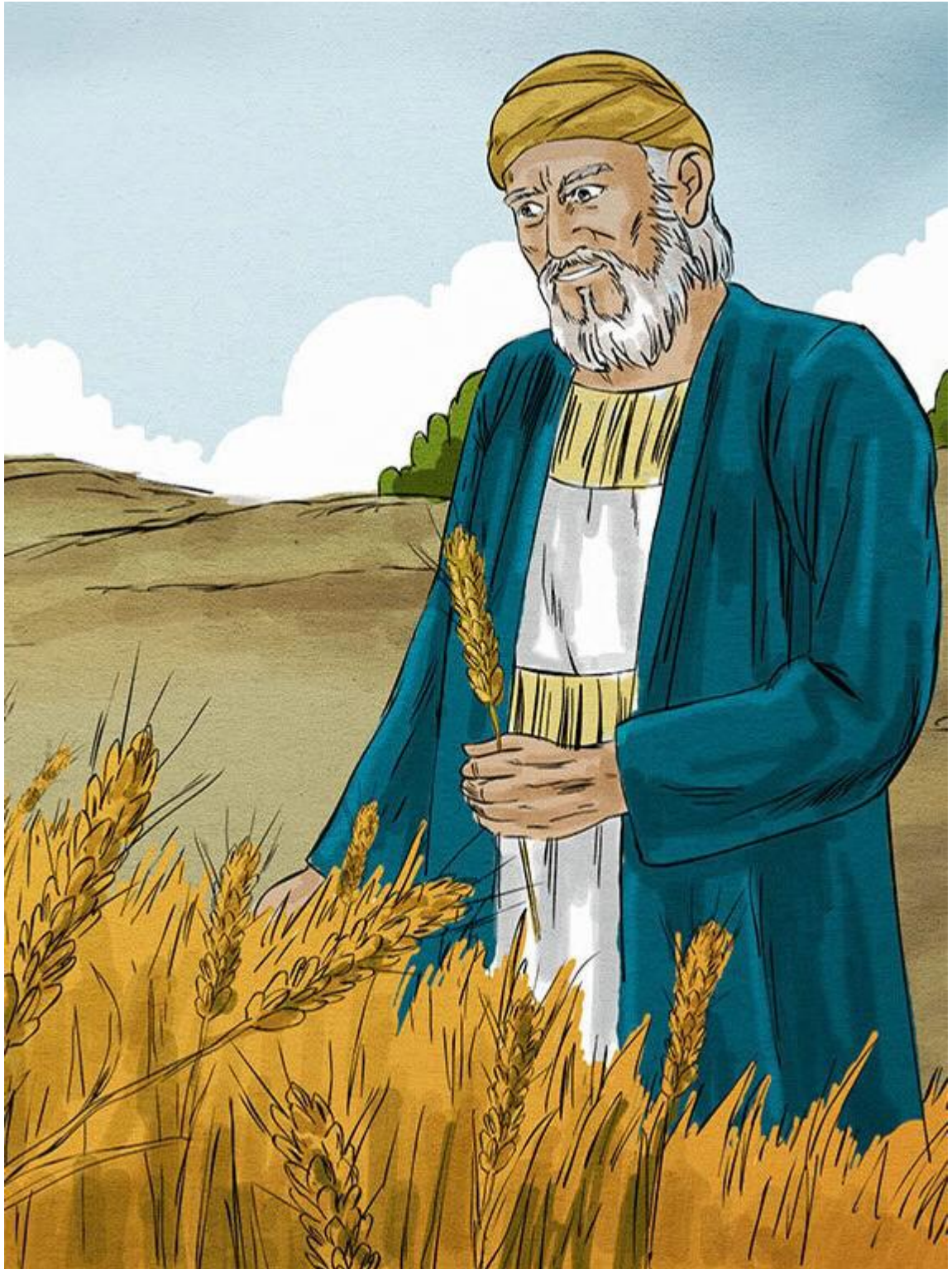

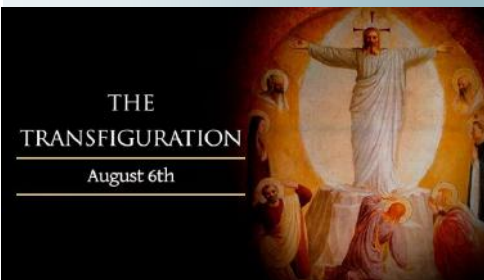

A message from Fr. Cryton

Importance of Eternal Values towards Need & Greed

We are in the 18th week of the ordinary time. We are called to reflect on the theme of the eternal values today. The human life always been a struggle between Need vs Greed. Let's reflect how these values can help us to face the crisis?

Jerry Kramer, in his second book entitled Distant Replay, said that if one wants to accomplish in life, he should at least, accomplish one thing. And what is that one thing? He said: "He should, at least, give his children proper values...that would help them survive in this world and flourish."

What values that would help us survive in this world? St. Paul in our second reading today says: "Seek and think what is above, not of what is on earth,". My dear friends, most of us are seeking and thinking not of what is above but most of the time of what is on earth. Supposedly, we have to seek the values of the Kingdom of God. These can help us survive in this world.

First, be thoughtful: We know that a thoughtful person is a contagious one. By being thoughtful in our everyday action, we do much to encourage people to follow our example. As we are we are living in a world surrounded with people with selfish attitude, our thoughtfulness is very much needed today.

Second, have good manners: Persons who have good manners are those who do not offend others, do not easily get angry, do not return evil for evil, do not monopolize conversation, and do not interrupt when someone else is talking. In other words, they are kind, friendly, respectful, courteous, agreeable, patient, civil and generous.

Third is charity: St. Paul exhorts us to love one another in peace as though we formed one family, bearing one another's defects. For St. Paul, charity is patient, kind, does not envy, not pretentious, not puffed up, not ambitious, not self-seeking, not provoked, thinks no evil, does not rejoice over wickedness and etc. (1Cor 13:4-7).

Everything that we see in and around us will someday come to an end even as the beautiful thought in Buddhism goes; this Too Will Pass Away. There is an end to all that exist including human relationships. The world we live is an uncertain world where we cannot anticipate a second of what comes next. There is uselessness in the storage of possessions while depriving the other of their basic wants.

Hoarding is one of the greatest sins in the world of today. There are people building their fortune at the cost of the other, not knowing who would possess them after they are dead and gone. Paul in his letter to the Colossians encouraged them saying that our focus should be on Christ. If Christ is our focus, we should look on the things that are above; the eternal values. Earthly possessions take us away from the domain of God. They take the place of God.

The gospel of today speaks to us about the uncertainty of our lives. So, there is no point in storing up for the unknown. It is best to share what we have with our neighbors because tomorrow is not in our control. The readings of today exhorts us with the message of sharing. *Let us not postpone the good things that we can do for the other because tomorrow may not be ours.*

Fun Facts By Deacon Tom :)

This week we'll look at the Sacrament of Baptism. Did you know that Baptism is the gateway to all the other Sacraments? You need to have received the Sacrament of Baptism before receiving any of the other sacraments. Baptism cleanses. During this sacrament we are claimed for Christ when our parents and god-parents trace the sign of the cross on our forehead.

There are two different types of oil used in this Sacrament. The breastplate is anointed with the Oil of Catechumens, this oil symbolizes strength. The crown of the head is anointed with Sacred Chrism, this oil symbolizes one being set apart and the Gifts of the Holy Spirit.

So why does the Church use oil? From the beginning of time oil has been used as a healing tool. The natural properties of oil is that it is absorbed into the skin/person, much like the presence of God. Two things are needed for this Sacrament to be valid: Water and the words, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Baptism is necessary for salvation. Please invite those who are not baptized to the Waters of New Birth!
