A message from Fr. Cryton,

The Secret of Narrow Gate

We are in the 21st week of the Ordinary time. The invitation today is to choose the narrow gate to enter into the Kingdom of God. As per Jesus, those who are saved are not necessarily those who regard themselves as God's chosen ones but rather those who walk a certain path in life. That path, of course, is precisely what he is proposing through his own life and teaching. It is a narrow door, he says, which many will not be able to enter.

Narrow Gate: What did Jesus mean by this expression? The door which Jesus had in mind was himself. "*I am the gate; whoever enters by me, will be saved*" (John 10:9). Through the cross Jesus opens the way for us to enter into his kingdom. But we must follow Jesus in the way of the cross. The word strive can also be translated agony. To enter the kingdom of God one must struggle against the forces of temptation and whatever would hinder us from doing the will of God.

Trusting in the Lord: One need to place his trust in the Lord as he walks through the narrow gate. This is another secret one becomes a winner in his life journey. I got an article some years back about the difference between Winners and Losers. It runs this way:

- The Winner is always part of the answer *The Loser is always part of the problem*.
- The Winner always has a program The Loser always has an excuse.
- The Winner says, "Let me do it for you" *The Loser says, "That is not my job."*
- The Winner sees an answer for every problem *The Loser sees a problem for every answer*
- The Winner says, "It may be difficult but it is possible *The Loser says, "It may be possible but it is too difficult."*
- When a Winner makes a mistake, he says, "I was wrong" When a Loser makes a mis take, he says, "It wasn't my fault."
- A Winner makes a commitment A Loser makes promises.
- Winners say, "I must do something Losers say, "Something must be done."
- Winners are part of the team *Losers apart from the team*.
- Winners see the gain Losers see the pain.
- Winners see the possibilities *Losers see the problems*.
- Winners use hard arguments but soft words Losers use soft arguments but hard words
- Winners stand firm on values but compromise on petty things Losers stand firm on petty things but compromise on values.
- Winners make it happen Losers let it happen.

The winners know the virtue of perseverance, which they gracefully blend with the lessons they learned from their mistakes. They are not necessarily people who have the best of everything but they make the best of everything.

The Losers on the other hand, take the path of least resistance. These people might have talent and a lot of skills but their losing attitude gets in the way of success. When the work gets tough, they stop, they quit.

So let us put our trust in God and walk in His ways. Then we will realize that we can do all things through Christ who gives us the strength to enter through the narrow gate.

Do you know the church has two Sacraments of Healing and Mercy? They are the Sacraments of Reconciliation and The Sacrament of the Sick. This week we will look at the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Reconciliation was once called "confession" or "penance."

Medicine and therapy can heal a wounded body, but Catholics believe that only God's grace can heal a wounded soul. That's why Jesus left us the sacrament of Reconciliation to heal our spiritual wounds, which we call sin. Did you know the word Reconciliation means "to go with again"?

Just as tumors are benign or malignant, Catholics believe that sins are venial or mortal. In other words, some sins aren't considered as serious as others and merdly inflict a slight wound to the soul, but others are so intrinsically evil that they're considered deadly

If you haven't gone to the sacrament of reconciliation in a while, don't be afraid "little camper!" 1. Remember that this Sacrament is about healing and mercy! 2. You want your soul to be well and Christ wants your oil to be well! 3. Hearing the words of Absolution brings so much joy and peace!

If you are truly sorry for "whatever" or even sorry that it's been "forever" since you celebrated this Sacrament? **Then what's keeping you**?


