

A message from Fr. Cryton,

Crosses in Jesus' Discipleship

We are in the 23rd week of the ordinary time. Jesus through today's Gospel is making it clear that his discipleship is not of worldly power and glory, rather is an invitation for a loyalty which would sacrifice the dearest things in life. Perhaps, we must not take his words literally. Jesus needs full commitment and fullest love oriented towards him. Jesus wants real disciples, not who follow him distantly.

For more than 10 weeks now we have been walking with Jesus as He makes His way to Jerusalem where He will lay down His life for the salvation of the world. Each Sunday, as we continue listening to the continuous proclamation of St. Luke's Gospel, we are invited to join Jesus as His disciples too in His pilgrimage. He tells us the meaning of authentic discipleship.

For Fr. Jerry Orbos, the Lord mentions three reasons that block discipleship in todays' Gospel,

- **1. The first block is Relationships**: "If anyone comes to me without hating his mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters even his own life cannot be my disciple."
- **2. The second block is Lack of Perseverance**: "This one began to build but did not have the resources to finish."
- **3. The third block is Possessions**: "Every one of you who does not renounce his possessions cannot be my disciple."

What is it that is blocking us from being the Lord's disciple? What is it that is preventing us from doing our mission for the Lord.

Three Cs of Discipleship: The first C is Come. The second C is Calculate or Count. The Third C is Cross

I highlight on the Crosses that every Christian needs to carry.

Ten wanted persons with daily crosses,

- 1. The person who tries to be the right example to every child rather than talk about it.
- 2. The person who has a passion to help rather than a passion to be helped.
- 3. The person who is willing to say, "I was wrong, I was sorry."
- 4. The person who will look at temptation squarely and say, "No!"
- 5. The person who puts God's business above any other.
- 6. The person who throws himself totally into a project, then give a credit for its success to his helpers.
- 7. The person who has a ready smile and a pat on the back for others.
- 8. The person who brings his children to Church rather than sending them.
- 9. The person who can see his own faults before he sees the faults of others.
- 10. The person who gives his money, time and talent without thought of return.

Do You Know! - By Deacon Tom

Today we will begin to look at the sacraments of Community and Mercy! Just as three sacraments are for the sake of initiation, two sacraments are for healing. The Sacrament of Matrimony takes care of the family and the Sacrament of Holy Orders takes care of the society of the Church.

The Catholic Church distinguishes between a legal marriage and the Sacrament of Matrimony. Marriage is regulated by the civil government, which has certain rules that must be followed to make a marriage legal. The Sacrament of Matrimony means becoming husband and wife through a sacred covenant with God and each other.

Three elements are required for a marital union to be a valid sacrament. The participants must enter the Sacrament of Matrimony with the intention that their union be: **Permanent:** Unto death

Faithful: No adultery

Fruitful: Open to the possibility of children if God wills it.

Like the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Orders, the Sacrament of matrimony can only take place once between the same two people, unless one spouse dies. If a person was previously married and the spouse is alive, it must be demonstrated that the marriage was invalid, so the previous union can be declared null and void through an annulment. Annulments declare that a marriage was never a valid sacrament in the first place. A Valid Sacrament of Matrimony requires the presence of a priest or deacon, a bride and groom and two witnesses. The bride and groom are the real ministers of the sacrament, because their "I do," makes them husband and wife. The priest or deacon is just an official witness for the Church.

Next week we will conclude this segment on the sacraments by looking at the Sacrament of Holy Orders!
