#### A message from Fr. Cryton,

#### **Called to Persevere in Life**

We are in the 33 rd week of the ordinary time. I invite you to reflect on the theme of perseverance today. The great Thomas Edison once said – "Many of life's failures are people who did not realize how close they were to success when they gave up." The book of Hebrews says, "Let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles, and let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us." (Heb. 12:1). As per Ray Fowler, The Christian life is not a stroll through the park. Nor is it a 100-yard dash. It is a long-distance marathon, and we are called to run with perseverance the race marked out for us. He Further explains, what does it mean that we are called to persevere as Christians? Why does the Bible talk so much about perseverance?

A. We live in a fallen world.

**1. God does not promise us an easy life:** God created the world good, but we no longer live in paradise. We live in a fallen world where sin has affected our relationship with God, our relationships with each other and our relationship to the created order. God doesn't promise us an easy life, because he knows we live in a fallen world. Sin hurts. Sin kills. Sin destroys. And we live in a world that is filled with sin.

**2. We should expect trials:** Another reason God doesn't promise us an easy life is because he knows that as Christians, we should expect trials. We are called to persevere as Christians because life is not easy. We live in a fallen world, and as Christians we should expect trials.

**B. God does promise to be with us:** God offers us two things in particular as we go through life's trials.

**1. He gives us his peace:** God gives us his peace. It is a peace unlike anything this world has to offer. It is a peace unlike anything this world has ever experienced. Jesus Christ is the Prince of Peace, and his peace passes all understanding and will guard our hearts and our minds in him.

**2. He gives us his presence:** When we are going through the white-hot trials of life, we can take comfort in the fact that God has promised never to leave our side, never to leave us, never forsake us. We may not be able to see him visibly with our physical eyes, but he is there as sure as his word.

#### C. God promises great benefits to those who persevere.

**1. Our faith is shown to be genuine:** When we go through the trials of life, it is like gold being tested by fire to reveal all the impurities and melt them away. We put the gold through the fire to see what is genuine and what is not. Sometimes the trials of life can feel like we're going through the fire and our faith is shown to be genuine.

**2. Perseverance develops character:** We don't rejoice in trials for the sake of the trials themselves. Rather as Christians we may rejoice in the trials, we face because of the results they produce in us. The testing of our faith develops perseverance, and perseverance develops character. We don't develop character in a vacuum. We develop character in the trials of life as we persevere and become mature.
