

A message from Fr. Cryton,

Advent – A Beautiful Season for Preparation

The first Sunday of Advent which opens the new liturgical year (Year A), is an invitation for Christians to stay spiritually awake and to prepare for the Lord's coming. Advent, which means "coming" is a time of preparation for the great event to come, Christmas, the birth of Jesus, the light of the world. According to Fr. R.H. Lesser in his book entitled "Like Honey in the Rock" said that Jesus Christ has six comings. As per him,

The first coming of Jesus: This happened in Bethlehem, a village in a remote province of the Roman Empire. This refers to historical coming of Jesus which took place 2000 years ago. The second part of Advent focuses on this coming.

The second coming: This refers to Jesus' salvific mission. He saved us because he loved us. This also refers to God's kindness and mercy. He comes to us, every time we realize that we are saved and every moment someone experiences redeeming work of Christ.

The third coming: As St. Matthew said: "When the Son of man comes as King and all the angels with Him, He will sit on His royal throne and the people of all the nations will be gathered before Him...and He will proceed to judgment" (25:31). This reminds us the final judgement. "I was hungry, weak, poor, helpless, lonely, desperately in need...and you ignored me." In other words, we are reminded to get ready to be accountable when he comes again.

The fourth coming: The Lord comes in four different ways in the Eucharist, (a) through the meeting of the people of God in the Eucharistic assembly, (b) Through the person of priest, (c) the Word of God and (d) the Eucharistic species, the real presence in the Eucharist is a real coming. This Eucharistic presence most people are aware. We tend to neglect or forget the fact that he comes really and truly in every other sacrament as well. For example, we can really and intimately meet him in the sacrament of Reconciliation as a forgiving God.

The fifth coming: This is through the wind and the cries of children and the song of the birds and through rain. At times our eyes are not open to see his presence, our ears are not alert to hear his voice. The creation speaks the wonders and the love of God in every moment of our life.

The sixth coming: This is even more intimate one. It is mentioned by the Lord Himself: "If you love me, you will obey my commandments. My father will love you and we will come and make our permanent home within you," (John 14:23). I suppose most of us know something about this internal coming: but do we actually experience it? He comes to us and speaks through our conscience. Let's all say Maranatha, Come Lord Jesus.

The Four Advent Candles

As a Christian tradition, the wreath holds the four Advent candles. The candles represent Jesus coming as the light in darkness. One candle is lit each Sunday until all four candles are lit. As Christmas draws nearer, each candle brings a little more light into the darkness. Sometimes a white candle is lit on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day to symbolize that Jesus is with us. This can be referred to as the "Christ candle." Each of the candles lit before Christmas represent an aspect of preparation during the season of Advent: Each week we will give some background on each candle

<u>Week#1</u> Candle is named "The Prophecy Candle" and it represent "Hope". Purple is the primary color associated with Advent. Within the Catholic Church it symbolizes penance, preparation and sacrifice. During the first week of Advent, we remember


