

A New Years Message from Fr. Cryton

The Epiphanies of Life

Today we celebrate Epiphany of the Lord. Epiphany means to reveal, to show, or to make known. The enduring insight from the earliest days of Israel to our own modern Christianity is that God is not remote from us; God is actively involved. As per Anyo, God is present in the epiphanies of our life each day.

God is present in Good Times: Perhaps we think of these epiphanies only in way one – the good and nice events of our day. I stand on a beach and watch a perfect sunset and say to myself "yes, there is a God". I receive a gift of forgiveness from a friend and say to myself "yes, there is a God".

God is present in hardships: However, as believers we know that God comes to us, the essence of God is revealed, in the mystery of the crib and the cross. The depth of God's being is made visible in the vulnerability of a child and in the perfect weakness of a man on a cross.

God is present in daily life: We find God in the sacrament of everyday life. We encounter God in trials, sufferings, joys, triumphs, hopes, fears, defeats and successes that come to us each day.

- ...when our best efforts at work go unappreciated, God is present.
- ...when we make an "A" in a difficult class at school, God is present.
- ...when our child is born, God is present.
- ...when our parent dies, God is present.

On those mornings when we wake up, sit on the edge of the bed, rub our eyes, think of the problems we face, worry whether our life has any real meaning, and wonder if there is even really a God...God is present.

God is present in the way we serve our neighbor: The epiphanies of life are not just about us. God is forever the beggar outside our gate, the victim left on the side of the road and the voice of those who have no one to plead for their needs. We are not just called to be sensitive to God's presence within our own lives but we are also called to extend God's presence through our care for others. Each of us is called to be a living epiphany and a sacrament of God's love to the world around us.

- ...when we reach into our pocket and give to the poor, God is present.
- ...when we hug our child, God is present.
- ...when we work to correct an injustice, God is present.
- ...when we pray with a friend in the hospital, God is present.

God is with us. Sometimes all we have to do is take the time to open our eyes and see... open our ears and hear...open our hearts and feel the presence. May we all see and hear and feel the epiphanies of God in our lives this day and in each day to COME.

Did You Know/Tour of the church

This week I'd like to direct your attention to the wall closest to the railroad tracks, the wall with the big picture of The Divine Mercy. Our Feature is the statue of the Infant of Prague. Did you know the feast of the Infant of Prague is celebrated January 14? The Infant of Prague Celebrates the Mystery of the Incarnation. Originating in the Czech Republic. Patron of children, colleges, good finances and health. The original statue was created as a royal wedding gift from a Spanish Princess to her Austrian royal cousin. Standing 19 inches tall, with the left foot barely visible. The left hand encircles a miniature globe, surmounted by a cross, signifying the world-wide kingship of the Christ Child. The right hand is extended in blessing with the first two fingers being raised to symbolize the two natures of Christ, while the folded thumb and last two fingers touch each other representing the unity of the Blessed Trinity. Many miracles have occurred through intercession to the Divine Infant. During one invasion, all the children of the city were taken to the Church for protection - praying to the Infant, they were all saved. This promise of protection and blessing has inspired devotion and love of the Infant of Jesus of Prague.




