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

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### A Message from Fr. Cryton

"Be Perfect as your Heavenly Father is Perfect"

The liturgy of the word this weekend is an invitation to live a holy life. This is a wide spread theme throughout the Bible. As we are about to begin the season of Lent, it is a timely topic for our reflection. A web page (Wiki – How to be Holy), gives us some guidelines to journey with Holiness)

**1. Belong to God and thirst for holiness:** True holiness will only come once you give your life fully to God. In doing so, you will recognize how you have starved for holiness in the past and how you hunger and thirst for it in the present.

**2. Prepare your mind and heart:** Even though it is possible to achieve holiness, doing so is not often easy. You need to dedicate your mind and your heart to the practice if you have any hope of accomplishing the task. Be baptized by receiving the Holy Spirit as The Lord promised His followers, to be your guide and comforter, abiding with you forever.

**3. Avoid moralism:** Many people often get the wrong idea about holiness and think that it can be achieved simply by following a strict set of rules. Rules and rituals have their place, but when you start to care more about looking holy than being holy, you tread into the realm of moralism.

**4. Set yourself apart:** As noted, God's law does have a part to play regarding holiness. God commands his believers to set themselves apart from the sinfulness of the world. This does not mean shutting yourself off from the secular world, but it does mean following God's law even with secularism criticizes you for doing so.

**5.** *Practice self-control:* You will never escape temptation, even if you do start exercising holiness in your life. When you face temptation, though, you will need to control the harmful desire to give into it to maintain any degree of holiness. **6.** *Do not tolerate sin:* For the most part, this means being intolerant of sin in your own life. Being intolerant of sin also means rejecting it in the world around you, though. No matter how much you may love someone, when that person sins, you must not make excuses for the sin or accept the sin itself.

**7. Die to self but love who you are:** Dying to self means surrendering any desire that is not of God. That being said, God created you to be who you are, so you need not despise your existence. If anything, you need to love yourself in the same way that God loves you before you can approach God's level of holiness.

**8. Pray for holiness:** Being holy is a difficult task and cannot be done in the absence of God. Prayer is a powerful resource—one of the most powerful tools available to the believer, in fact—so praying for holiness on a regular basis can help you become and remain holier.

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# Did you know/Tour of the Church

This week we are looking at the symbol of the Harp. It is in the same large window in the middle of the church on "Mary's side" of the church. This symbol has several meanings. The soothing effect of the music of the harp is referred to 1 Samuel 16:16 1 Samuel 16:23 ; 18:10 ; 19:9 . The church in heaven is represented as celebrating the triumphs of the Redeemer "harping with their harps" (Revelation 14:2).



The harp is the national symbol of Ireland. The Celtic or Guinness harp faces to the left while the State harp faces to the right. So why the difference? Guinness had trademarked the harp symbol in 1876, and the Irish free state government of 1922 wanted to use the symbol they had to turn the harp the other way round. So I'm thinking, why not invite a friend to church and point out the Celtic Harp! **Deacon Tom**

## Lenten Regulations

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.
