A message from Fr. Cryton

Let us have Christ like Attitude

We begin the HOLY WEEK with PALM SUNDAY today. The theme for today's celebration is to have Christ like attitude. This Holy Week is a time to remember that God remains faithful despite our inconsistency and unfaithfulness. When the people saw hope that Jesus would lead them to liberation, they shouted: "Hosanna!" But when they saw that Jesus wouldn't follow their expectations, they shouted: "Crucify Him!". Fr. Jerry Orbos, SVD speaks of people who are with different attitudes.

- First, people are like wheelbarrows: They don't go anywhere unless pushed. They are the people who lack initiative, dependent, and no plan for their lives. They are the easy-go-lucky people.
- Second, some are like canoes: They need to be paddled. If you do not tell them what to do, they are immobile. You must be always in her/his side to remind or to monitor this person.
- Third, some are like kites: You must keep a string on them or else they fly away. Just like the rat, when the cat is away, it goes its way.
- Fourth, some are like kittens: They are contented when they are petted and patted. There are some people who need to be appreciated always every time they perform a work. If we cannot, they are discouraged or in other words, attention-seeker.
- Fifth, people resemble footballs: They are people unpredictable. No way to tell which way they will bounce next.
- Sixth, some are like balloons: They are full of air and ready to blow up. They only see the mistakes in others.
- Seventh, some are like neon lights: They flash on and off.
- **Eighth, those few who are like good watches:** They are with open face, pure gold, quietly busy and full of good works. They are the people who work without expecting any payment or return. They just work and participate without string attach. Just for the greater glory of God.

Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others. In your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus. (Philippians 2:3-5 NIV).

Did You Know/ Tour of the Church

This week we are looking at the image directly above the stained glass image of St. Patrick (which is in the middle of the church on St. Joseph's side of the church.) This image is rich in salvation and Marian symbolism connecting images from the Old Testament and the New Testament.

The first symbol is what appears to be a large letter S wrapped around the Cross and the large letter M (a Marian symbol.) This is symbolic of the saraph or bronze serpent that Moses was instructed to make in the twenty-first chapter of the Book of Numbers. In that chapter the people grumbled against Moses so the Lord sent saraph serpents that bit the people and the people died. Moses prayed for the people and the Lord told Moses to make a bronze serpent and mount it to a pole; and if anyone who was bitten and looks at it will recover. This was an Old Testament prefiguration of Jesus' salvific act of hanging on the Cross for our salvation.

The center symbol is the Cross. The symbol of our salvation. However if you notice that the Cross comes "out of" or is "a part of the letter M.

The artist of this window is symbolically showing how our salvation was prefigured in the Old Testament and how Jesus came forth from Mary through the power of the Holy Spirit. There is great thought and depth of the combining of Old Testament and New Testament Marian symbolism in this window. It makes me think. How much thought would it take for you to invite someone to church next week? After all it will be Easter?



INGREDIENTS

- 1 cake yeast 1 1/2 cups warm wat
- teaspoon salt
- 1 tablespoon sugar 4 cups flour:
- 1/2 whole wheat 1/2 unbleached

PREPARATION Dissolve the yeast into warm water, then add the salt and sugar. Blend in the flour mixture. Knead dough until smooth. Cut into small pieces. Roll into ropes & twist into pretzel shape. Place on lightly greased cookie

sheets. Brush pretzel with 1 beaten egg Sprinkle with coarse salt. Bake immediately at 425 degrees for 12-15 mins
