A Message from Fr. Cryton,

Do you Love Me? (From Unnamed Author)

Did You Know/ Tour of the Church

This week we will look at our second "hidden window!" This window is on "Mary's side of the church. You can see this window from the choir loft or if you stand right next to the wall by the silver holy water dispenser and look straight up you can see the stained glass image of the two crossed keys.

The crossed keys represent the metaphorical keys that Jesus promised to St. Peter, empowering him to take binding actions in leading the institution of the Catholic

Church. In short, they are a symbol of the Pope's authority. St Peter was the first pope, and those who succeeded him share in the power Jesus gave him. If keys open doors, then the symbolic meaning of crossed keys means open the doors of perception; in doing so you see a broader view of the world.


