A Message from Fr. Cryton,

Invitation to be an Altar Server

We are in the 11TH SUNDAY OF THE ORDINARY TIME. June, the month of Ministries continues with the focus on serving at the altar. This weekend, let me share some thoughts on role and benefits of being an altar server. It is really encouraging together with children some adults too getting involved in this ministry at St. Mary's. As we focus on this ministry this weekend, we encourage more families, children, young and adults to join us to make our liturgy more meaningful.

"Being a server means serving God and God's people," says Fr. Kwatera in his guide for servers. It's a ministry, like the kind of service that ushers, readers, ministers of Holy Communion offer at Mass each weekend. The altar servers support the flow of the entire service. St. Paul VI called altar servers "little priests." Just like a priest whom the church refers to as an ALTER CHRISTUS, an altar server as a little priest may also be referred as a "LITTLE" ALTER CHRISTUS," a little "another Christ".

Benefits of Being an Altar Server

- 1. Learning: They learn to serve with love and to perform the smallest details beautifully. By becoming an altar server, one begins to learn these things and it makes all the symbols of the Mass and rich culture in the church so much more understandable and interesting.
- 2. Responsibility: Serving at the altar teaches to be responsible and punctual. From an early age, especially children acquire good sense, and commitment to the Holy Mass.
- 3. Efficiency: Every altar server becomes skillful and efficient. If something fails or is missing during the liturgy, they're the ones in charge of solving it with skill and speed. Communication, teamwork, perceiving what needs to be done and doing it, punctuality, selfconfidence, and the list goes on. Serving on the altar is a great place to start building these
- **4.** Companionship: Being an altar server fosters companionship among the servers. They learn to share and distribute tasks. The older ones teach and guide the younger altar servers.
- 5. Faith: Serving at Mass helps them grow in piety (participation in prayer) and fortitude (physical and spiritual dedication). By serving at the altar, one pays more attention to the whole Mass to help you remember where your part fits in. By focusing and understanding what's going on, the Mass can then lead one into a much deeper relationship with God and one feels the impact of Mass far greater and to love, revere and praise God.

More than everything this ministry helps one to understand the vocation. Every vocation (whether marriage, consecrated singlehood, religious life or priesthood) is awesome and leads us to a greater and deeper understanding and relationship with God. Altar Serving is a great way to begin to see that beauty more fully in both priesthood and religious life.

Throughout the month of June we'll highlight the different ministry roles at Mass. Lector, ushers, choir members, and altar servers. You can sign up for these roles on the sign-up sheet in the vestibule or contact the parish office. Thank you!


The Ladies Sodality Banquet


