





A Message from Fr. Cryton,

We are called to be Mature Disciples of Jesus

THE 13TH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME is an invitation to reflect the nature of discipleship. A disciple is someone who follows a Master. It is someone whose life is shaped by the teaching of the Master. It is someone who becomes like the Master in every way, adopting the values, attitudes, actions, and principles of the Master teacher. In short, a disciple is molded and shaped into the Master's image. Let me share some characteristics of a mature disciple pointed out by Doug Franklin.

1. MATURE DISCIPLES UNDERSTAND THEIR NEED FOR A SAVIOR: Mature disciples know God's core plan for salvation. They have internalized that they are slaves, held captive by terrible enemies: sin and death, and they see that in this fallen, corrupt, and shattered world, they need a rescuer-Jesus, our savior and redeemer.

2. MATURE DISCIPLES RECOGNIZE THAT THEY ARE MADE IN GOD'S IM-

AGE: Mature disciples before they determine who they are, they focus on whose they are. They affirm that God created human beings in his own image. Mature disciples also find in their God-given identity a God-given mission. As image bearers of the one true God, they seek to be his representatives here on earth.

- **3. MATURE DISCIPLES SHARE THEIR FAITH STORY:** The Good News of Jesus Christ is the greatest gift we can receive. Through Jesus' life, death, and resurrection, we are adopted as God's children. We are made holy, receive the Spirit, and enter into eternal loving relationship with our Lord. Mature disciples follow Jesus' instruction to share his Good News with others: As mature disciples reflect on the transformation in their own lives and Jesus' influence on their journey, they yearn for those same things in others' lives.
- **4. MATURE DISCIPLES DEFEND THEIR FAITH:** The Bible encourages us to defend our faith: "Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect," (1 Peter 3:15). That's the point of apologetics—to explain our hope in Christ to others. Mature disciples are equipped to communicate God's truth in a world that is hostile towards him. They don't share God's truth in an overbearing way, but they display a confidence and a willingness to unashamedly and respectfully engage our culture.
- **5. MATURE DISCIPLES JOIN IN THE COMMUNITY OF BELIEVERS:** Mature disciples don't take the journey of discipleship alone. When we're adopted as children of God, we gain millions of spiritual siblings who are on the same journey. whenever Scripture describes the life of a disciple, it's in the context of a community of faith. Mature disciples seek unity and community with other growing disciples.

"Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says" (James 1:22).






Did You Know/Tour of the Church By Deacon Tom

We are staying in the same corner of the church, the same corner of the picture of Pope John Paul II. Here we see a statue of St. Patrick. At first look at the statue you might be disappointed. Where is the color? The short answer might be that both the statues of St. Patrick and the statue of St. Boniface (in the other corner of the church) were probably bought as a set. Both are similar in style and color.

We are familiar with seeing St. Patrick standing on a snake. The legend of St. Patrick and the snakes is rather an allegory for his eradication of Pagan ideology According to legend, Patrick drove snakes into the sea after they attacked him during a 40-day fast.

However, did you know, post glacial Ireland never had snakes. When Patrick drives the snakes out of Ireland, it is symbolically saying that he cast out the old religion and brought in a new one. Our statue may be "a little bland" for some but it shows us St. Patrick holding the new church and crushing paganism. Patrick was born in Britain near the end of the 4th century. He is believed to have died on March 17, around 460 A.D.


