

A Message from Fr. Cryton,

An Inspiring Character

WE ARE IN THE 20TH WEEK OF THE ORDINARY TIME. The Gospel reading portrays the strong faith of Canaanite women. William Barcley, the great Theologian has the commentary on this particular event.

FIRST LOVE: This woman had love. In this sense she made the misery of her child her own. She is a pagan but, in her heart, there was that love for her child which is always the reflection of God's love for His children. It was love that made her approached Jesus, accepted His silence and still appeal to Him. It was love that drove her to come near to Jesus.

SECOND FAITH: The woman had faith. She called Jesus as Son of David. It is a political title and yet full of meaning. A faith started to grow in her in which she looked at Jesus as a great and powerful wonder worker. Even though she came to Jesus like a magician but she ended up calling Him, 'Lord.'

THIRD PERSISTENCE: This woman had indomitable persistence. She was undiscourageable. So many people, it has said, pray really because they do not wish to miss a chance. This woman came to Jesus because Jesus was not just a possible helper; He was her only hope. She came with a passionate hope, a clamant sense of need and a refusal to be discouraged. For her, prayer was no ritual form but an outpouring of the passionate desire of her soul which somehow felt that she could not and must not and need not take no for an answer.

LASTLY CHEERFULNESS: This woman had a gift of cheerfulness. She was in the midst of trouble; she was passionately in earnest and yet she could smile. You know God loves the cheerful faith, the faith in whose eyes there is always the light of hope, the faith with a smile which can light the gloom.

I hope that we own these things present in this woman so that we may continue to live in spite of the conflicts we encounter in the future. Let us make this woman as our inspiration.

Did You Know/Tour of the Church By Deacon Tom

Now let's look at the Tabernacle. What does the word "Tabernacle" mean? Originally, a tabernacle was a tent said to contain the Ark of the Covenant. The word comes from the Latin *tabernaculum* for "tent." Later it came to mean a place Jews worship, like Christians worship in a church.

The function of a Tabernacle in a Catholic church is described as follows: The tabernacle is a liturgical furnishing used to house the Eucharist outside of Mass. This provides a location where the Eucharist can be kept for adoration of the faithful and for later use (e.g., distribution to the sick and homebound). It also helps prevent the profanation of the eucharist.

Let's take a closer look at our Tabernacle!

Picture 1 is what you see from the pew. The veil that hangs outside the tabernacle changes in color to match our Liturgical celebration or season.

Picture 2 is what you see when the veil is swung open. On the wooden part of the Altar and on the tabernacle itself you see the Latin initials I H S which came to stand for **Jesus Savior of Humankind**. This is Iesus (Jesus) Hominum of humankind) Salvator (Savior).

Picture 3 is what you see when the key is turned. The two outer doors swing open and two inner doors are revealed with the Greek initials A W. These are the first and last letters in the Greek alphabet. The Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end.

Picture 4 is what you see when the key is turned farther. The two inner doors open to reveal the contents of the tabernacle. In our tabernacle in the small monstrance, the ciborium holding the Eucharist, the pyx that holds our low gluten hosts and the luna that holds the large host for our large monstrance. If you look closely at. The picture you will also see two the image of two angels one on each door.
