A Message from Fr. Cryton,

Peter the Rock

THE 21ST WEEK OF THE ORDINARY TIME gives us another leading character in the New Testament. He is none other than Simon who became Peter. Let us see how Jesus entrusts responsibilities to Peter. Jesus gives Peter a new name, declares him a foundation and empowered him to rule over the Church Jesus would soon inaugurate.

First, Jesus gives Peter a new name: The man we know as Simon Peter is originally a plain Simon, the fisherman. All the evidences point to him as a born leader. He is the leader of the fishermen. He is chosen as the leader of apostles and chosen as the companion of Jesus. He was the spokesperson of the group. In every listing of the apostles' name, his name

For recognizing Jesus as the Messiah, he is rewarded with a second name, Peter which means rock. In the ancient times, names were important. They expressed the parents' hopes for what their child would be and do in life. By naming this apostle, Peter, Jesus does more than express hope. The name is His pledge that Peter would, in fact be, like a rock, strong, solid and enduring.

Second, Jesus declares Peter as the foundation: There are so many different explanations as to what the rock is all about. And I would like to give theses explanations to you which are different, as mentioned by William Barclay, in his commentary that:

Jesus as the Rock: St. Augustine took the rock to mean Jesus Himself. It is as if Jesus said: "You are Peter and on myself as a rock I will build my Church and the day will come when, as the reward of your faith, you will be great in the Church."

Truth as the Rock: The rock is the truth that Jesus Christ is the Son of the living God. To Peter this great truth has been divinely revealed. The fact that Jesus is the Son of God in indeed the foundation stone of the Church's faith and belief but it hardly seems to bring out to play on words which is here.

Peter's Faith as the Rock: The rock is Peter's faith. On the faith of Peter, the Church is founded. That faith was the spark which was to kindle the faith of the worldwide church. It was the initial impetus which was the one day to bring the universal church into being.

Peter himself as the Rock: Peter was the first man on earth to discover who Jesus was; he was the first man to make the leap of faith and see in Him the Son of the living God. So, Peter was the first member of the Church where the whole Church is built on him.

Third, Jesus empowers Peter: The New Catechism of the Catholic Church states: "The Church is apostolic. She is built on a lasting foundation – 'the Twelve Apostles of the Lamb,' (Rev. 21:14). She is indestructible (Matt 16:18). She is upheld infallible in the truth. Christ governs her through Peter and the other apostles who are present in their successors, the Pope and the College of Bishops," (no. 869).

Today, we have Peter's successor, the Pope. The Pope continues to proclaim the truth of Christ as our Lord and real hope of the Church. Let us pray for our Pope and be united with one another as members of this Christian community.

Right above the tabernacle you see what is in the first picture. You see a crucifix on a

stand. Above the crucifix are three angels (Seen in the first picture). When you look at it from the side you will see on the wood a chalice with a host. Upon further review, when you look closely you will see that the wood panel behind the crucifix is actually a door. (Seen in picture 2)

This area of the main Altar was used to house the monstrance. The monstrance with the Blessed Sacrament would be taken out for Adoration. If you look closely you can see where the door could be locked.
