The Ambo

What is an Ambo in the Catholic Church? The word Ambo means "to go up" it stands in the sanctuary near the Altar. Where we hear God speak to us through Sacred Scripture. The word comes from a Greek word meaning "step" or "elevation." Since the 4th century Christians were accustomed to using a raised platform during Mass to chant or read the Epistle and Gospel and the priest gives the homily. An Ambo is placed to the right (the congregation's left) of the Altar. If you are wondering is there a difference between a pulpit and an ambo? No, they mean the same thing.



RCIA will be starting soon! If you or someone you know is interested in becoming a member of the Catholic Church, please ask Deacon Tom or the parish office for more info. The RCIA process is a long-standing form of initiation. In order for one to confirm their faith in Christ, one must complete the Rite of Confirmation.




