

#### A Message from Fr. Cryton,

## DEVELOPING FRIENDSHIP WITH GOD

WE ARE IN THE 26<sup>TH</sup> SUNDAY IN THE ORDINARY TIME. The liturgy of the word today invites us to respond God's call. We are also called to develop friendship with God in order to fulfill the above task. In the Chapter 12 of Rick Warren's book, *The Purpose Driven Life*, which was sub-titled as, Developing Your Friendship with God, it is said that like any friendship we must work at developing our friendship with God. He gave at least four ways on how to develop our friendship with God.

**FIRST, WE MUST CHOOSE TO BE HONEST WITH GOD**: God does not expect to be perfect, but he does insist on complete honesty. If we look at the Bible, friends of God were not perfect. If perfection was a requirement for friendship with God, we would never be able to be His friends. Fortunately, because of God's grace, is still the, 'friends of sinners,' (Matt 11:19).

**SECOND, WE MUST CHOOSE TO OBEY GOD IN FAITH**: That every time we trust God's wisdom and do whatever He says, even when we don't understand it, we deepen our friendship with God. We obey God, not out of duty, fear or compulsion but because we love Him and trust that He knows what is best for us.

**THIRD, WE MUST CHOOSE TO VALUE WHAT GOD VALUES:** This is what friends do they care about what is important to the other person. The more we become God's friends, the more we will care about the things He cares about like: the redemption of His people. He wants all His lost children found! Friends of God tell their friends about God.

FOURTH, WE MUST DESIRE FRIENDSHIP WITH GOD MORE THAN ANYTHING ELSE: An example, for this is David in the Book of Psalms by which he used words like: longing, yearning, thirsting, hungering, etc.

### Did You Know/Tour of the Church By Deacon Tom

The center focus in our Sacred Space is our Altar. Our Altar symbolizes Christ. Our Altar is used for sacrifice.

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) maintains that: The Altar on which

the sacrifice of the cross is made present under sacramental signs is also the table of the Lord to which the people of God are called together to participate in the Mass, as well as the center of the thanksgiving that is accomplished through the Eucharist (no 296).

The symbol on the center of our Altar is a "shortened" form of the word "Christ." In Greek it would look like (Xqlotoc)

You may wonder what is place on our Altar? Only what is required for the celebration of the Mass: namely, from the beginning of the celebration a small crucifix, and the Book of the Gospels; then from the Presentation of the Gifts until the purification of the vessels, the chalice, patten and ciborium and finally, the corporal, the purificator, the pall and the Missal.
