Winners vs Losers

THE THIRTY SECOND SUNDAY IN THE ORDINARY TIME is a reminder for all of us to be wise as we are heading towards our goal. This message is given to us through the parable of ten virgins today.

What Jesus is telling us in this parable is: "Keep our eyes open, for we do not know the day nor the hour when the Lord will come," in other words, we should prepare for His coming in us. As per a homily by a priest,

First, we are supposed to be alert and prepared for Christ's coming at the midnight of our lives or when we die. The day of our death is not a day or doom. Rather, it is the day of joy because we can see God face to face.

Second, we are supposed to be alert and prepared when Christ comes in everyday of our lives. He comes to us in the things we do, in what happens to us and in the people we meet. Yet quite open we are insensitive to His presence.

Third, how do we develop a sense of preparation? The answer is by praying. To pray does not mean that we neglect our work and play, but rather that we pause occasionally to pay attention to the Lord.

Another thought given by an unknown author as the foolish virgins were losers. It is entitled Winners vs. Losers.

The Winner – is always part of the answer.

The Loser – is always part of the problem.

The Winner – is always has a program.

The Loser – is always has an excuse.

The Winner – says: 'Let me do it for you.'

The Loser – says: 'That's not my job.'

The Winner – sees an answer for every problem.

The Loser – sees a problem in every answer.

The Winner – sees a green near every sand trap.

The Loser – sees two or three traps near every green.

The Winner – says: 'It may be difficult but it's possible.'

The Loser – says: 'It may be possible but it's too difficult.'

Let us open our eyes and see that we have so many things to prepare. Let us open our eyes and hear what God wills for us and what others are wanting from us.

Did You Know/Tour of the Church By Deacon Tom

There are two flags displayed in our church. They are the American Flag and the Papal Flag. Protocol states that the American flag is displayed on the right (Your Left) of the Altar and the Papal flag to the left (Your Right) of the Altar.

The Vatican Flag is a vertical bicolor of gold and silver however it appears in the colors of yellow and white. The gold (yellow) symbolizes heavenly power with the silver (white) representing Earthly power. Centered in the white band is the Papal Coat of Arms.



The Papal Coat of Arms consists of two keys are wrapped in a red ribbon which binds these two authorities together. The color red is said to symbolize Jesus' blood and sacrifice which binds the powers together. The three-tiered papal tiara which is positioned above the keys

is the traditional attire worn by the pope. There are many interpretations of the meaning behind the three-tiered tiara, however, one popular belief is that the number three represents the Pope's responsibility as a priest, prophet, and king.


