

Lenten Reflection on Laetare Sunday

ON THIS FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT, the Church invites us to rejoice because God loves us so much. This Sunday of Lent has traditionally been considered as "Laetare Sunday", and it is fitting to think of this day as a time for joy. Hence in this time of penance and conversion,

LET US BE JOYFUL the fact that God has been merciful to us and is willing to extend His mercy to us over and over again.

LET US BE JOYFUL that when we live and practice mercy each day, we allow the good things that God gives to all of us as a result of our fidelity: happiness, peace, serenity and consolation are results of a mercy-filled life.

LET US BE JOYFUL as we prepare to encounter the Lord as He offers his life for us: we will never experience true joy unless we encounter the Paschal Mystery in our own lives, as Christ's Passion and Resurrection is the fount and wellsprings of true happiness in life.

As we are approximately halfway through Lent this Sunday, it is good to remind ourselves of the lessons that we have learned so far during this wonderful season. A reflection from a journal, 'Seminarians' Musings', help us to reflect the following thoughts.

- 1. The reality of sin: Sin, which is willful disobedience to the commands of God, exists. It exists on a personal level (when we by knowledge, will, and freedom choose to sin rather than do good), and in a societal level (when our collective decisions and policies do not follow the will of God but rather our own wills). This sin is caused by our hardness of heart or the incapacity to see as God sees things, and at the same time by our human weakness and sinful inclinations that we have gained from our first parents.
- **2. The reality of God's mercy:** Where sin abounds, the grace of God prevails. In many readings during this season, we have seen how God calls his own people back from the darkness and blindness of sin into new life through the various covenants he has established with his people. In the fullness of time, Jesus was sent by the Father to be the vessel of His mercy, to bring it to a people who needed light, healing, refreshment, peace, and forgiveness.
- **3.** The mission of Jesus and his Church: It is this love in the form of mercy that becomes the "heart" of the mission of Jesus on earth. Today's Gospel is about the intimate conversation of Jesus and a Pharisee named Nicodemus. In this brief but very powerful Gospel passage, we learn that the love of God for sinful humanity is the reason that Jesus was sent on earth. He comes to save the world by His own redeeming action, rather than condemning us in our sins.



COMMENTARY ON THE INVOCATIONS OF THE LITANY OF LORETO (Part 3)

Mother inviolate, pray for us! The first woman, Eve, sinned and brought on herself the following sentence: "I will intensify the pangs of your childbearing; in pain shall you bring forth children." (Gen 3:16). Mary, as immaculately conceived, she was not subject to the effects of original sin. And it was thus that she gave birth to the savior as a Virgin, as completely pure, without suffering and pain. This is a special mystery, which St. Augustine explain: "Just as the rays of the sun penetrate glass, and despite this do not harm it nor destroy it, so also Mary bore Christ, the Sun of righteousness, without any violation of her virginity." Virgin most powerful, pray for us! St. James writes: "The fervent petition of the just man is powerful indeed" Could not the most special friends of God, the saints, accomplish this? 5 How much more so can the Most Holy Virgin? St. Anselm calls upon her: "O Immaculate Virgin, higher than the patriarchs, higher than the martyrs, higher than the confessors, higher also than the virgins..." Mary is Mother of the All-Powerful Son of God. If Her Son is All-Powerful by nature, then she is all-powerful by grace, so she is the Virgin most powerful in every sense of the word.
