

A message from Fr. Cryton,

Let Us Enter into Holy Week

Holy Week is a solemn week of extra prayer and fasting. This is also the most sacred time in the Church's liturgical calendar, entirely focused on Jesus' Passion, death, and resurrection. A recurrent theme throughout the week is a call to accompany Jesus during this most painful part of his life on earth. Let us reflect with Barry Howard, as he provides some valuable points to ponder during Holy Week.

- Every temple needs cleansing now and then: This includes those built of brick and mortar and those composed of flesh and blood.
- Parables prompt us to stop and think: Rather than telling us what to think, the stories of Jesus stimulate us to think more deeply about the intersection of life and faith.
- Servants lead, and leaders serve: Taking up the towel and basin is simultaneously an act of service and an expression of leadership.
- Commands are non-negotiable: A mandate is different than a prerogative or a preference. For example, "Love one another" is a command to be obeyed, not an option to be considered.
- **Table time is treasured time:** Breaking bread around the table with friends is an occasion to be remembered.
- Pray the prayer of holy indifference: Jesus prayed, "Not my will, but your will be done." I must pray the words of this prayer continually because my will is so blatantly self-oriented.
- Beware of those who kiss up to you: They either have an agenda of their own or they are in cahoots with those plotting a coup.
- Avoid judging others: In fact, be careful not to judge Judas, for we too may be tempted to betray Jesus, but for much less than 30 pieces of silver.
- Going along with the crowd is always a risky venture: Crowds seldom make wise decisions. The will of God is rarely determined by popular vote.
- Death does not have the final word: The Resurrection declares that life conquers death and hope prevails over despair.

Whatever plans I have in minds, Lord, I surrender them to you. I will do the best, I can but in the end, let your will be done.

Pope Francis announced March 19th that he accepted Bishop William Patrick Callahan's retirement request and appointed Bishop Gerard Battersby to succeed Bishop Callahan and serve as the 11th Bishop of the Diocese of La Crosse. Bishop Battersby was born on May 15th, 1960. In 1993, he entered Sacred Heart Major Seminary and received a Master of Divinity degree in 1998. After ordination to the priesthood, he served in parish ministry for ten years. Bishop Battersby then served as director of graduate seminarians and graduate pastoral formation at Sacred Heart Major Seminary, Detroit. In 2011, he was appointed Vice-Rector and Dean of Seminary Formation and was ordained to the Episcopacy as an Auxiliary Bishop of Detroit and Moderator of the South Region in January 2017. Bishop Battersby will be installed as the Bishop of the Diocese of La Crosse on May 20th at the Cathedral of St. Joseph the Workman.

Holy Thursday: Mary's Meals - Mary's Meals is a nonprofit organization that provides school feeding programs in some of the world's poorest communities, where poverty and hunger prevent children from gaining an education. They currently serve 2,429,182 hungry children every school day in 18 countries across the world. Thanks to many volunteers in the countries where they work, it costs just \$25.20 to feed a child for an entire school year. Currently the situation in Ethiopia is dire: A combination of drought, displacement and brutal conflict has left huge areas of the country in crisis – and Tigray, where Mary's Meals works, is one of the worst affected. A two-year civil war which killed 600,000 people, caused widespread destruction and left physical and mental scars on people including millions of children – many of whom have missed years of schooling. 

COMMENTARY ON THE INVOCATIONS OF THE LITANY OF LORETO (Part 5)

Saints in grace, virtue and glory. St. Peter Damian writes: "To You, O Virgin and Queen, has been given all authority in heaven and on earth; for You, nothing 7 is impossible. Would, therefore, He who from your body took His own body be able to withstand this power? You approach the golden altar of reconciliation with a petition, but also with a command as a mother, and not as a servant."

Queen of confessors, pray for us! "Whoever acknowledges that Jesus is the Son of God, God remains in him, and He in God" (1 J 4:15). Those who have faithfully lived according to this principle we call confessors. Their Queen is Mary! Mary did not doubt in Jesus for even a single moment and stood next to Him, as if she wanted to call out to the whole world: He, who is here on the cross is truly the Son of the

Queen of all saints, pray for us! The Most Holy Virgin shines above all the

living God, Jesus Christ, to whom be honor and glory forever!
