

A Message from Fr. Cryton,

Three Principles in Christian Life

TODAY IS THE THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT. This Sunday readings remind us to go back to the three basic principles of Christian life and they can also be called the Three Rs of Christian life. I found this thought in one of the homilies of a priest.

The first R or principle is RELATIONSHIP: Christianity is not just a religion but also a relationship. The essence of the ethics of Jesus is not only a law but a relationship of person to God. We pray, we worship, we attend Mass and we read the Bible because we want to deepen this kind of relationship with Him. We deepen not only our relationship with Him but also our relationship with the other people. The North American Indians had a very beautiful definition of a friend. For them the word, 'friend' is 'someone who carries my sorrows in his back.' Therefore, we can say that if a person or a friend comes to us for an advice, most often, he wants nothing more than our presence, listening ear, quiet caring and less about our suggestions and solutions to their problems.

The second R or principle is RELIANCE: Reliance or dependence on God is more basic to our fulfillment than dependence on material things. No doubt, money is the sixth sense which enables us to enjoy the other five. But the picture of the merchants being driven out by Jesus from the Temple warns us of preoccupation with money. This second principle reminds us of what somebody had said that money can buy food but not appetite; money can buy medicine but not health; money can buy a house but not a home; money can buy companions but not friends; money can buy everything but not eternal happiness. Let us rely on God because without Him we can do nothing.

The third R or principle is RENEWAL: Religion is in the heart and not only in the knees. It is because no matter how long our prayers are with our knees on the floor of the church but if we do not change our hearts for the better, nothing will happen and nothing will change. It is said that our hearts should be operated because our hearts are full of foolishness like: Hhatred, E-envy, A-anger, R-resentment and T-timidity.

A Note: Naming the Church Hall – St. Bridget Hall

The year 2024 is a memorable year for St. Mary's Parish Community for a special reason. We are celebrating the 125th anniversary of the building of the present St. Mary's church. We have been preparing for this from last year. As you have noticed in our year planner, March 10th 2024, we have scheduled to name our church hall (basement) as 'St. Bridget Hall'.

The name St. Bridget is not new to St. Mary's parish Community. The first parish of Lyndon Station began in the year 1851, dedicated as St. Bridget Parish. As the church got moved to the new location, the church was renamed as St. Mary's (The detailed Parish history will be published soon).

When the idea was put forward to name our church hall as one of our jubilee projects, both Jubilee committee and parish pastoral council unanimously agreed to name the hall as St. Bridget Hall as a remembrance of our original church.

I welcome you all to join us for this event on Sunday the March 10th after 9 am mass together with pancake breakfast organized by Knights of Columbus.

Healing Mass & Service at Sacred Heart Church, Cashton, WI



COMMENTARY ON THE INVOCATIONS OF THE LITANY OF LORETO (Part 2)

Lord, have mercy on us. The Litany begins with the invocations, "Lord, have mercy on us, Christ, have mercy on us" as well as the invocations to the Three Persons of the Holy Trinity, that is, to God Himself. This introduction appropriately frames our prayer. It reminds us that in the long run, we always pray to God and it is He whom we ask for His mercy. Jesus established the Church, which constitutes His Mystical Body. The Lord therefore invited people to cooperate in His saving work. Mary and the saints have their role to play in the mission of reconciling God with the world. Prayer to Mary and the saints has a different character than prayer to God Himself. At the heart of the matter is a petition for prayer, for intercession, which is why we repeat the refrain: "pray for us." Queen of peace, pray for us! This last invocation was introduced into the Litany of Loreto during World War I. At that time, it seemed that the war would not end and that peace would never reign among the nations." Our Immaculate Mother merited this distinction, since it was she who gave us Him, whom the prophet Isaiah foretells as the "Prince of Peace" (Is 9:5), and who Himself said, "Peace I leave with you, my peace I give to you" (J 14:27).
