October: The MESSAGE OF HIS HOLINESS POPE FRANCIS FOR WORLD MISSION DAY 2024

Go and invite everyone to the banquet (cf. Mt 22:9)

Dear brothers and sisters!

The theme I have chosen for this year's World Mission Day is taken from the Gospel parable of the wedding banquet (cf. Mt 22:1-14). After the guests refused his invitation, the king, the main character in the story, tells his servants: "Go therefore to the thoroughfares, and invite to the marriage feast as many as you find" (v. 9).

I take this opportunity to thank all those missionaries who, in response to Christ's call, have left everything behind to go far from their homeland and bring the Good News to places where people have not yet received it, or received it only recently. Dear friends, your generous dedication is a tangible expression of your commitment to the mission ad gentes that Jesus entrusted to his disciples: "Go and make disciples of all nations" (Mt 28:19). We continue to pray and we thank God for the new and numerous missionary vocations for the task of evangelization to the ends of the earth.

Let us not forget that every Christian is called to take part in this universal mission by offering his or her own witness to the Gospel in every context, so that the whole Church can continually go forth with her Lord and Master to the "crossroads" of today's world. "Today's drama in the Church is that Jesus keeps knocking on the door, but from within, so that we will let him out! Often, we end up being an 'imprisoning' Church which does not let the Lord out, which keeps him as 'its own', whereas the Lord came for mission and wants us to be missionaries. May all of us, the baptized, be ready to set out anew, each according to our state in life, to inaugurate a new missionary movement, as at the dawn of Christianity!

Finally, let us lift our gaze to Mary, who asked Jesus to perform his first miracle precisely at a wedding feast, in Cana of Galilee (cf. Jn 2:1-12). The Lord offered to the newlyweds and all the guests an abundance of new wine, as a foreshadowing of the nuptial banquet that God is preparing for all at the end of time. Let us implore her maternal intercession for the evangelizing mission of Christ's disciples in our own time. With the joy and loving concern of our Mother, with the strength born of tenderness and affection (cf. Evangelii Gaudium, 288), let us go forth to bring to everyone the invitation of the King, our Savior. Holy Mary, Star of Evangelization, pray for us!

Stewardship Bulletin Announcements October 20, 2024 Twenty-ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time IS 53:10-11; PS 33:4-5, 18-19, 20, 22; HEB 4:14-16; MK 10:35-45 OR 10:42-45 | Today's Gospel resounds with the call to imitate Christ through humility and service. This call is not just a suggestion but a powerful invitation to live as Christ did. The readings remind us that the Son of God became man and surrendered His life into the hands of men to save us. Jesus centered His life around His Father's mission and the service of mankind. And this is how we ought to live — in imitation of Christ. James and John wanted to ensure they had a spot in heaven with Jesus. They were concerned about themselves at that moment— "Grant that in your glory we may sit one at your right and the other at your left." Jesus quickly reminded them, "Whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant; whoever wishes to be first among you will be the slave of all." Our culture constantly encourages us to do what we can to get ahead and do what feels good, no matter the effects — that power, authority, and wealth should be our goals. In stark contrast, our faith offers us something different and fulfilling – a life of humility and service. Our faith offers us something different and fulfilling — a life of humility and service. As Christian stewards, we live in service of God and neighbor, just as Jesus did. Our life is not about us. It is about fulfilling God's glorious plan for each one of us. So, we must ask ourselves, are we living out God's plan for our lives? Is my life centered on Christ and those around me, or is it centered on me? It can be difficult to know God's plan for our lives. He sees the whole picture—we only see the now. But our faith reassures us that all we can do is seek Him daily. If we center each day on Him, then our entire lives will become the work of Jesus.

A Minute with Jesus: Receiving the Eucharist is our Closest Union with Jesus on Earth | God will never stop loving me. Our heavenly Father speaks these words to me in the Bible: "My steadfast (unwavering, always ongoing) love shall not depart from you" (Isaiah 54:10). God proved His love for me in this way: "God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, so that whoever

believes in Him may not die but may have eternal life" (John 3:16). God's boundless love includes Jesus establishing one Church and instituting seven sacraments so that we may be united with Him. The closest union we can have with Jesus on earth is receiving the Eucharist – His own body and blood.

Let's pray this right now and every day this week: Heavenly Father, help me to know how much You truly love me. This week, read how nothing can separate us from the love of Jesus Christ except our own choice to reject His love in Romans 8:35, 37-38.
