

DECREE

The liturgical celebration of the Blessed Virgin Mary under her title the Immaculate Conception is a grace-filled day particularly in our nation, as she is our Patroness. In the past, when December eighth landed on a Sunday, the Solemnity was transferred to Monday without the obligation following. However, a recent clarification from the Dicastery for Legislative Texts has stated: "Can. 1246 §1 establishes the feasts that must be observed as days of obligation. The canon does not provide for exceptions. For those reasons, those feasts are always days of obligation, ... even when the aforementioned transfer occurs. Therefore, in that year, the feast must be observed as a day of obligation on the day to which it is transferred." That means, this year, December ninth is a Holy day of Obligation.

This clarification, coming so close to the Solemnity itself, causes some problems with it adjoining the second Sunday of Advent and being so close to Christmas when communal penance services often occur. Since a priest's time is limited and calendars are hard to change, I believe a dispensation is appropriate for this year for the **obligation** to attend Mass on December ninth. With the obligation being lifted, the number of Masses will not need to be unnecessarily multiplied, but I do ask each of my brother priests to have at least one Mass in which the people of God may celebrate the great gift of the Immaculate Conception. Her great *fiat* is inspiration and hope to each of us and is wholly worthy of our honor. I do ask each of the faithful to do some form of extra prayer if unable to attend the holy Mass, particularly praying the Rosary with at least one other person in community.

Stewardship Bulletin Announcements October 27, 2024 Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time JER 31:7-9; PS 126:1-2, 2-3, 4-5, 6; HEB 5:1-6; MK 10:46-52 | Our Psalm today, "The Lord has done great things for us; we are filled with joy," sheds light on our glorious Gospel reading about the healing of the blind man, Bartimaeus. We can learn a lot from Bartimaeus about our relationship with Jesus. Many of us struggle with something from which we need healing—physical blindness, illness, addiction, unhealthy habits, anger, or sin. Do we confidently cry out to Jesus in our weakness, knowing He will help us? Often, we begin to, but then a voice in our thoughts tells us to doubt and encourages us to stop trying, like the crowd in our Gospel. Although that voice is persistent and intense, we are called to cry out all the more. Bartimaeus's story is a testament to the power of persistence in faith. If Jesus can hear one voice in a crowd of many, He can listen to our direct prayer to Him in our hearts. Our Gospel story closes with the miraculous moment when Bartimaeus is healed. The conversation with Jesus was simple. Jesus asked Bartimaeus what he would like Him to do. This man, blind for who knows how many years, desired sight. His request was humble and straightforward, showing us that we don't need elaborate prayers or grand gestures to reach Jesus. Jesus responded, "Go your way; your faith has saved you." He was healed and continued to follow Christ. Bartimaeus did not have to do much to become healed. All he needed was his undoubting faith. Whatever we are struggling with in this life, Jesus asks us to have faith in Him. This faith is not just a belief but a powerful force that can move mountains. It's a force that can heal, strengthen, and guide us. As a result, we will remain steadfast in our relationship with Christ and have the strength to keep going. Although we might not be healed, Jesus still hears our confident cries. Through our faith, we will indeed be healed in the next.
