A Message from Father Cryton....

Bishop Battersby invites us for the Mass of Reparation

(Thursday March 27th 10 am @ St. Joseph the workman Cathedral, La Crosse)

Bishop Battersby is hoping that all our clergy and many of our lay faithful will attend the Mass of Reparation. It will be held at 10am in the Cathedral on Thursday, March 27.

What is this about? Bishop plans to precede the Mass with prayers seeking reparation for any and all grave harm perpetrated in our diocese during our 157-year history, including harm caused by our priests and bishops. None of us can undo that harm, but we can call on Jesus to remove the barriers to his love that we have imposed, with confidence that he is eager to unleash the fire of his love throughout our diocese. With humility and repentance, we give him full permission to do what only he can do.

Finally, an excellent explanation of reparation is found paragraphs 181-204 of Pope Francis' newest encyclical, Dilexit Nos. [https://www.vatican.va/content/francesco/en/encyclicals/documents/20241024-enciclica-dilexit-nos.html] Francis explains how, when we engage in reparation, "we offer the heart of Christ a new possibility of spreading in this world the flames of his ardent and gracious love." (Paragraphs 181 &182 are given below)

REPARATION: BUILDING ON THE RUINS

181. All that has been said thus far enables us to understand in the light of God's word the proper meaning of the "reparation" to the heart of Christ that the Lord expects us, with the help of his grace, to "offer". The question has been much discussed, but Saint John Paul II has given us a clear response that can guide Christians today towards a spirit of reparation more closely attuned to the Gospels.

The social significance of reparation to the heart of Christ

182. Saint John Paul explained that by entrusting ourselves together to the heart of Christ, "over the ruins accumulated by hatred and violence, the greatly desired civilization of love, the Kingdom of the heart of Christ, can be built". This clearly requires that we "unite filial love for God and love of neighbor", and indeed this is "the true reparation asked by the heart of the Savior". [192] In union with Christ, amid the ruins we have left in this world by our sins, we are called to build a new civilization of love. That is what it means to make reparation as the heart of Christ would have us do. Amid the devastation wrought by evil, the heart of Christ desires that we cooperate with him in restoring goodness and beauty to our world.

A Minute with Jesus: As Catholics, we believe that Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist. | We humbly give our assent to what has been handed on to us for the last 2,000 years through the one Church that Jesus founded. This assent (giving our "yes — I choose to believe") involves our commitment to persistence in prayer and study of Scripture in asking Jesus for deeper understanding regarding His Real Presence in the Eucharist. Let's pray this right now and every day this week: Lord Jesus, "I believe; please help my unbelief." (Mark 9:24) This week, read how a father gives his assent to believing that Jesus can heal his son in Mark 9:20-29.

Lent begins on Wednesday, March 5. You are Invited to Set aside your phone for 15 minutes a day | How about setting a simple goal to "unplug" during the 40 days of Lent? This time can be replaced with quiet reflection. There is no time like the present to commit to conversation with God on a daily basis. This will provide a great opportunity to draw closer to Christ and find greater peace in your life. Choose a time and ask God to help you to be faithful. It may be just what you are looking for!

Lenten Regulations | The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, March 5. Lenten regulations are as follows:

- Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent, and Good Friday.
- In addition to abstaining from meat, Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, until they celebrate their 59th birthday, are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Those who are bound to this regulation may eat only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

Stewardship Bulletin Reflection March 2, 2025 - Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time SIR 27: 4 -7; PS 92: 2-3, 13-16; 1 COR 15: 54-58; LK 6: 39-45 | Today's readings exhort us Christian disciples to form ourselves—mind and heart—in imitation of Christ so that we may better reflect His goodness in our daily lives. The first reading from Sirach offers timeless counsel: "The fruit of a tree shows the care it has had: so too does one's speech disclose the bent of one's mind. Praise no one before he speaks." Jesus uses the same analogy in today's Gospel reading from Luke: "A good tree does not bear rotten fruit, nor does a rotten tree bear good fruit. For every tree is known by its own fruit." Everything we have is a gift from God, and we are to use these gifts for His honor and glory, including the gift of speech and, even more broadly, all forms of modern-day communication email, text. TikTok, Twitter, Instagram, Facebook, and the rest, What comes from our mouths. keyboards, or phones reflects our minds and hearts. Our ability to communicate with each other is a gift we must steward well. In the same Gospel passage, Jesus reminds us, "No disciple is superior to the teacher; but when fully trained, every disciple will be like his teacher." This lesson is a powerful reminder of your potential. The more time we spend with Jesus, our teacher, through regular prayer and a vigorous sacramental life, the more we will become like Him. Then, all we do and say (tweet and post) will bring others closer to Him; this is the life's work of the Christian steward. It is privileged work indeed.
