At 7.35 [21.04.2025] the Bishop of Rome. Francis, returned to the house of the Father. His entire life was devoted to service to the Lord and His Church. He taught us to live the values of the Gospel with fidelity, courage and universal love, especially in favour of the poorest and most marginalized. With immense gratitude for his example as a true disciple of the Lord Jesus, we commend the soul of Pope Francis to the infinite merciful love the One and Triune God".



A Minute with Jesus: The Eucharist is the Great Miracle of Mercy | In His great love for us, Jesus gave us a great miracle of mercy: The Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. Stewardship Bulletin Reflection April 27, 2025 - Second Sunday of Easter/Sunday of Divine Mercy ACTS 5:12-16; PS 118: 2-4,13-15, 22; REV 1:9-11A, 12-13, 17-19; JN 20: 19 -31 Today, the Second Sunday of Easter is Divine Mercy Sunday. Our Gospel reading from St. John is often called the story of "Doubting Themas" but the pageoga involves much merce

St. John is often called the story of "Doubting Thomas," but the passage involves much more than the encounter with the skeptical apostle. It is a profound testament to the transformative power of Christ's mercy, which extends to all, including us, His modern-day disciples. While Thomas traditionally gets the bad rap for his doubts, none of the Apostles were at their best when Christ appeared to them after His resurrection. They were hiding behind a locked door, paralyzed by fear and doubt. But Jesus appeared right in their midst despite the lock on the door. Was it to rebuke them for their lack of faith? Quite the contrary. He comes on a mission of mercy. He comes to offer them peace and restore their relationship with Him. And even more, He commissions them to become ministers of His mercy by giving them authority to forgive sins. At that moment, Christ gives us the supreme gift of mercy — the sacrament of Reconciliation. His mercy is a gift and a vital tool for our spiritual growth and healing. What a precious and powerful gift! This Sunday is perfect for reflecting on how well we use this gift. Do we appreciate its healing power? Could we become better stewards of this gift by going to Confession more often? We must also reflect on how well we extend mercy to others as Jesus did to Thomas that day. Sometimes, this could be through forgiving those who have wronged us, showing compassion to those in need, or simply being patient and understanding in our interactions. Let's commit ourselves to becoming faithful disciples and stewards of Christ's mercy. As stewards, we must share and practice Christ's mercy in our lives and community. We will be those very ones to whom Jesus gave a 'shout out' during His encounter with Thomas: 'Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed' - in His merciful love.
