So if you're broken, if you don't believe, if you're tired of the lies... come anyway. With your anger, your doubt, your dirty backpack. No one here will ask you for a VIP card.

Because this Church, as long as I breathe, will be a home for the homeless, and a rest for the weary. God doesn't need soldiers. He needs brothers and sisters.

And you, yes, you... are one of them."

A Minute with Jesus: Confession – a preparation for receiving the Eucharist | The best way to prepare to receive Jesus in the holy Eucharist is by going to confession, also referred to as the sacrament of reconciliation, penance. We want to receive Him with a clean heart. If it is not possible to go to confession before receiving Jesus, make a sincere act of contrition in your heart, and as always pray with sincerity the prayer at Mass, "I confess to Almighty God..." A person who knowingly and willingly commits a sin that is mortal - serious or grave - must receive the sacrament of reconciliation before receiving holy Communion in order to repair the severed relationship with Jesus. If you are not sure about this, speak with a priest. Let's pray this right now and every day this week: Jesus, please give me the grace to be truly sorry for my sins. This week read how God calls us out of darkness into His own wonderful light in 1 Peter 2:9-10.

Stewardship Bulletin Reflection May 18, 2025 - Fifth Sunday of Easter ACTS 14:21-27; PS 145:8-13; REV 21:1-5A; JN 13:21-22A, 34-35 Today's readings for

this fifth Sunday of Easter are filled with inspiring and uplifting messages for us. Christian stewards. The Gospel of John includes this well-known verse: "My children...I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, you should also love one another." What a succinct description of a stewardship way of life! It sounds simple, but simple does not necessarily mean easy. How is Jesus calling us to love? He loved (and loves) serving and sacrificing His very life for us. This means we should demonstrate compassion, forgiveness, and selflessness in our interactions with others. That is a tall order, but we can strive to fulfill it daily. Living a life of service and selfsacrifice is challenging because it requires us to resist our selfish inclinations constantly. However, the more we empty ourselves of "self" by serving others, the more space we create in our hearts for God to pour His grace into us. Amazingly, the more we give our lives away to others, the more He fills us with Himself, who is love itself. And amid the inevitable challenges that this way of life brings, we can find comfort in the assurance that the Lord, who loves us so much that He died for us and established the Eucharist as our strength and nourishment, is present with us every step of the way. As we face the challenges of living as Christian stewards, we can still rejoice in the wonder of the Resurrection this Easter season. We find great joy in following in our Lord's footsteps and in loving as He loves.
