A Message from Fr. Cryton,

Ascension - Calls us to live Our Easter Journey Daily

Today, as we celebrate the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord, we are reminded that Jesus' earthly mission has transitioned into the mission of the Church, our mission. Though He has ascended to the Father, He remains with us always, guiding us through the Holy Spirit.

Easter: Not a Destination, but a Way of Life: Many Christians approach Easter as if it were a beautiful mountain peak, we climb toward it with anticipation, celebrate at the summit, then descend back to ordinary life. But this misses the profound truth of resurrection: Easter is not a destination we visit annually; it's a new country we're called to inhabit daily. The Easter celebration doesn't end on Sunday morning, it begins there. The empty tomb opened not just a moment of victory, but an entirely new way of being human. When Christ conquered death, He didn't just win a battle; He established a kingdom where resurrection life becomes our daily reality.

The Resurrection Life: More Than Memory: The disciples discovered that resurrection wasn't something they remembered, it was something they lived. Thomas touched the wounds and found them real. Peter ate breakfast with the risen Christ on the beach. Mary Magdalene heard her name called in the garden. For them, Easter moved from past tense to present continuous.

What Does Daily Resurrection Look Like? Living Easter daily means recognizing that God specializes in bringing life from death, not just at the end of time, but in the middle of Tuesday afternoon. It means seeing every closed door as a potential tomb that God might roll away. It means treating every ending as a possible new beginning, every failure as seed for future growth, every loss as space for unexpected grace.

As Easter people, we are called to carry the light of Christ into the world, sharing His love, hope, and mercy in our daily lives. Let us not leave the joy of Easter behind but allow the Resurrection to transform us each day. May we be witnesses of Christ's presence, living with faith, courage, and joyful expectation as we await the fulfillment of His promises.

"You will be my witnesses... to the ends of the earth." (Acts 1:8)

Stewardship Bulletin Reflection June 1, 2025 - Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord ACTS 1:1-11; PS 47:2-3, 6-9; EPH 1:17-23 or HEB 9:24-28; 10;19-23;

LK 24: 46-53 On this Feast of the Ascension, a day filled with deep joy and celebration, we commemorate Christ's victorious return to the Father after fulfilling His mission on earth. This Feast, which holds great significance in our spiritual journey, marks a joyful commemoration of the "launch day" of our commissioning as Christ's disciples. This moment fills us with hope and inspiration. Today's Gospel focuses on the explicit guidance Jesus provided to His disciples—and, by extension, to us—just before His ascension to the Father: "Thus it is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You, each of you, are witnesses of these things, entrusted with the crucial task of spreading His message. Adopting a stewardship lifestyle—focused on how we use our time, talent, and treasureenables us to live in a way that reflects the Good News of the Gospel. As a parish family, we take time each year to renew our commitments in these three domains. However, it is essential for each of us to allocate time throughout the year to continually evaluate our commitments, considering both our strengths and areas where we can grow further. On this Feast of our 'launch day,' let us pause to celebrate our achievements as Christ's disciples. Let us reaffirm our unwavering commitment to remain faithful to Him and the unique mission He has given us, recognizing that our accomplishments reflect His grace and our steadfast dedication.
