A Massage from Recycle Mission Group

We are St. Mary Recycle Mission Group and we have been working with Catholic churches, Convents, Schools, The Knights of Columbus, and other organizations, as well as with Parishioners who have things at home in helping rescue and recycle used religious items that are no longer needed.

We can take in or give just about anything of religious nature that can be used by other churches, convents or religious organizations such as:

- Vestments including Chasubles, Stoles, Albs, etc. (even if they are soiled or tattered, as we have them professionally cleaned and/or restored if possible so they can be worn, we can also use them to make new vestments, rosary cases or missal covers, we accept any style, color, vintage)
- Crucifixes, - Statues (any size, no outdoor concrete statues), - Rosaries (damaged ok), - Chalices (Pottery ok but please not by mail), - Altar Ware, - Candle Sticks, - Tabernacles, - Relics, - Monstrance, - Altar Stones, - Altar Books/Missals/Lectionaries, - Holy Medals, - Holy Cards, - Linens, - Paraments, - Framed Religious Pictures, - Used Musical Instruments, - Prayer books//Breviaries/Catholic Encyclopedias

(Please No Religious Books/Reading Books/Story Books, Hymnals, Pamphlets/Magazines/DVD's, VHS Tapes, Christmas items or Wax Candles)

* Please remember, this is a recycle program that works both ways, if you are in need of items that you cannot financially afford, please email us your needs, and we will help you. Items we supply you are of no cost to you and we also cover shipping costs or will personally drop off items to you when we are in your area. *

We will be in your area for pick-ups between July 14th and July 25th. Please consider cleaning out the closet and placing us in your bulletin for parishioners to bring in religious items from their home to recycle.

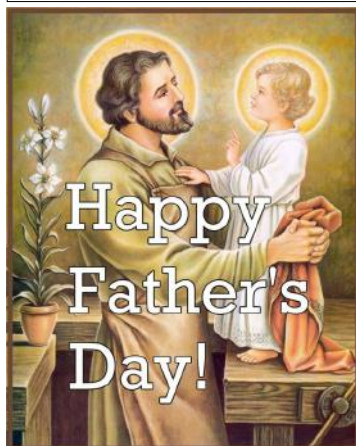

Stewardship Bulletin Reflection June 15, 2025 - The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity PRV 8:22-31; PS 8: 4-9; ROM 5:1-5; JN 16: 12-15

Today, we celebrate the feast of the Most Holy Trinity. This feast is somewhat unique in that it honors a doctrine rather than an event. What we are commemorating today is a central reality of our Christian faith: God is Trinitarian in nature — three distinct persons, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit — in one God. The Church refers to this truth as a mystery, as indeed it is. It is not a mystery in the sense that it is a question that must be answered, but instead in the sense that the depths of this truth are far beyond our human comprehension. Some have said that “mystery” in this context is “not a wall to run up against but an ocean in which to swim.”

Contemplating the “ocean depths” of this mystery can make us humans feel so small, and almighty God so far from us. Yet nothing could be further from the truth as today’s readings demonstrate. The first reading, from Proverbs, reveals that God found “delight in the human race.” This shows that the greatness of God does not distance Him from us. One aspect of the Trinitarian nature that we can grasp is that God is inherently relational. Logically, He would delight in being in a relationship with us, whom He created in His image and likeness. This understanding should bring us comfort and reassurance. In the second reading, St. Paul reminds us that God not only delights in us, but He is intimately connected to us. ‘The love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.’ This is not just a permission for us to draw near to Him, but a desire to dwell in the very depths of our being and all the intimate details of our lives if we allow Him. This understanding should make us feel cherished and loved. Finally, in the Gospel of St. John, we learn that God holds nothing back of Himself from us. Jesus tells His disciples (this includes us!) that the Holy Spirit “will take from what is mine and declare it to you. Everything the Father has is mine.” Thus, we find ourselves drawn right into the midst of this Trinitarian love. If the mystery of the Holy Trinity is an ocean in which to swim, the “water” that makes up that ocean is love. What then should be the response of the Christian steward to this sublime mystery? All we can do is worship. And offer our lives back to God in total gratitude for calling us to live in the richness of such unfathomable love. This week, let’s reinvoke God into the midst of our lives and ensure that the way we spend our time and energy each day reflects our profound gratitude for His many gifts to us, above all, the gift of Himself in the Trinity — Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. This understanding should inspire and uplift us in our daily lives.
