Pope's Message Regarding Middle East War

Regarding the ongoing wars in the Middle East, Pope Leo XIV asked the faithful to go to their churches or to the nearest church to pray. The Pope also issued a warning to the world, saying: "The wars in the Middle East, and now also in Ukraine and Crimea, will become very serious and will spread. To stop them, we must pray to God to fill the world with His mercy and for the Holy Spirit to enlighten the rulers so that they may have the knowledge of good and evil and fight together for peace and love."

Call for Responsibility & Reason

On June 14 at his public audience in St. Peter's Basilica and on X (formerly Twitter), he urged both Israel and Iran to act with "responsibility and reason," emphasizing:

"No one should ever threaten the existence of another."

He underlined the importance of reconciliation and dialogue as the only paths to a peace grounded in justice, fraternity, security, and dignity.

Renewed Appeal for Dialogue

On June 16 in a catechesis during the Jubilee of Sport, he remarked, "The situation in Iran and Israel has seriously deteriorated", and strongly reiterated his June 14 plea, stressing nuclear disarmament, sincere dialogue, and that it is the "duty of all countries" to pursue paths of reconciliation.

"We must not get used to war"

At his June 18 General Audience in St. Peter's Square, the Pope stated:

"We must not get used to war!", warning against the allure of "powerful and sophisticated weapons," and quoting Pope Francis: "War is always a defeat!"

He also echoed Pope Pius XII: "Nothing is lost with peace; everything may be lost with war.".

Personal Plea in TV Interview

On June 19 in an interview with Italian state TV (TG1), he made an intimate appeal:

"We must try at all costs to avoid the use of weapons and seek dialogue through diplomatic means." He emphasized that many innocent lives are being lost and again urged collective effort to find peaceful solutions.

The Story Behind the Feast of Corpus Christi | By: Gretchen Filz

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, historically known by its Latin name, Corpus Christi, celebrates the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist—Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. It is Traditionally celebrated on the Thursday following the Solemnity of the holy Trinity. The feast dates to the Middle Ages and originated with a visionary nun and a Eucharistic miracle. THE STORY: In 1263 a German priest, Fr. Peter of Prague, made a pilgrimage to Rome. He stopped in Bolsena, Italy, to celebrate Mass at the Church of St. Christina. At the time he was having doubts about Jesus being truly present in the Blessed Sacrament. He was affected by the growing debate among certain theologians who, for the first time in the history of the Church, began introducing doubts about the Body and Blood of Christ being actually present in the consecrated bread and wine. In response to his doubt, when he recited the prayer of consecration as he celebrated the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, blood started seeping from the consecrated host and onto the altar and corporal. Fr. Peter reported this miracle to Pope Urban IV, who at the time was nearby in Orvieto. The pope sent delegates to investigate and ordered that host and blood-stained corporal be brought to Orvieto. The relics were then placed in the Cathedral of Orvieto, where they remain today. This Eucharistic Miracle confirmed the visions given to St. Juliana of Mont Cornillon in Belgium (1193-1258). St. Juliana was a nun and mystic who had a series of visions in which she was instructed by Our Lord to work to establish a liturgical feast for the Holy Eucharist, to which she had a great devotion. After many years of trying, she finally convinced the bishop, the future Pope Urban IV, to celebrate this special feast in honor of the Blessed Sacrament, where none had existed before. Soon after her death, Pope Urvan instituted

Corpus Christi for the Universal Church and celebrated it for the first time in Orvieto in 1264, a year after the Eucharistic Miracle in Bolsena. Inspired by the miracle, Pope Urban commissioned a Dominican friar, St. Thomas Aquinas, to compose the Mass and Office for the feast of Corpus Christi. Aquinas' hymns in honor of the Holy Eucharist, *Pange Lingua, Tantum Ergo, Panis Angelicus,* and *O Salutaris Hostia* are the beloved hymns the Church sings on the feast of Corpus Christi as well as throughout the year during Exposition and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ Himself" (CCC paragraph 1324). The very word, Eucharist, means "thanksgiving" or "gratitude," and so this feast is significant to all of us who strive to live as grateful stewards of all God's blessings. The Eucharist, as the greatest of all blessings, is not only from God; it is God - the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of our Lord, Jesus Christ. As stewards, we are called to recognize and appreciate this divine gift and to share it with others through our actions and service. Today's second reading from St. Paul's letter to the Corinthians reminds us of the depths of love our Lord has shown us in the gift of the Eucharist, recalling Christ's words at the very first Eucharistic celebration. "The Lord Jesus... took bread, and, after he had given thanks, broke it and said, 'This is my body that is for you.'" In that moment, and at every celebration of the Mass thereafter, Jesus gives us His very self in an act of complete humility and perfect love. How can we possibly express our gratitude for such a sublime gift? We can receive the gift of the Eucharist with the utmost reverence and love, recognizing the profound significance of this act. Following our Lord's example, we can give ourselves generously to others in the week ahead.
