**Prayer Changes Things: Let Us Pray for Peace** | Will you gather your family for 10 minutes a day to pray one Decade of the Rosary? The Rosary is a Scripture-based prayer. It begins with the Apostles' Creed, which summarizes the great mysteries of our Catholic faith. The Our Father, which introduces each mystery, is from the Gospels. The first part of the Hail Mary is the angel's words announcing Christ's birth and Elizabeth's greeting to Mary and the second part is asking Mary to pray for us. The Mysteries of the Rosary center on the events of Christ's life. The repetition in the Rosary is meant to lead us into restful prayer, providing guidance to situations that we face. The gentle repetition of the words helps us to enter into the silence of our hearts, where Jesus dwells. **Stewardship Bulletin Reflection June 29, 2025 - Solemnity of Sts. Peter and Paul, Apostles Acts 12:1-11; Ps 34:2-3, 4-5, 6-7, 8-9; 2 Tim 4:6-8, 17-18; Mt 16:13-19** In June, we celebrated significant moments in the life of the Church — Pentecost, the Most Holy Trinity, and Corpus Christi — culminating today with the Solemnity of Sts. Peter and Paul. Though they are very different men, they are united in faith, mission, and martyrdom, and the Church has honored them together since the third century. St. Peter, the first Pope, was chosen by Christ as the rock on which the Church would be built. The Catechism tells us that because of the faith he professed, Peter remains the “unshakeable rock of the Church.” Despite his human weaknesses, Peter’s loyalty, repentance, and leadership serve as a powerful model of stewardship. St. Paul, once a persecutor of Christians, became one of the Church’s greatest evangelists. In today’s second reading, Paul reflects on his mission, saying, “I have finished the race... the crown of righteousness awaits me.” The Greek word he used for “crown” — stephanos — refers to a victor’s crown, rather than a royal one, illustrating his view of faith as a race well run for the sake of Christ. Although they were martyred separately, tradition holds that Peter and Paul were in Rome at the same time, and their shared witness and sacrifice bind them closely together in Church history. They embody two essential aspects of stewardship — Peter in his faith and leadership, and Paul in his zeal and wisdom. As stewards, we are called to follow their example—to build the Church through our commitment, to overcome our failures through God’s mercy, and to proclaim the Gospel with courage. Like Peter and Paul, we are invited to give all we have for the sake of Christ and His Church.
