



A Message from Fr. Cryton,

Month of June: A Month Full of Grace and Glory

As we have stepped into the month of June, we have embraced by a season overflowing with spiritual richness and divine mystery. This month stands as a liturgical jewel in the Church's calendar, filled with great feasts and solemnities that invite us to go deeper in our relationship with the Lord and to marvel at the profound truths of our faith.

The Solemnity of Pentecost – The Gift of the Holy Spirit: We begin June with the powerful celebration of Pentecost, the birthday of the Church. On this day, we commemorate the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles and the birth of the missionary Church. Pentecost reminds us that we are not alone; the Spirit dwells within us, guiding, renewing, and empowering us to live as witnesses of Christ in our world today.

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity – The Mystery of God's Inner Life: Shortly after Pentecost, we celebrate the Most Holy Trinity—a feast not of a doctrine, but of a divine relationship. One God in three Persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. This mystery is the very heartbeat of our faith. The Trinity is not distant or abstract; it is the loving communion we are called to reflect in our lives.

The Solemnity of Corpus Christi – The Body and Blood of Christ: Next, we rejoice in the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. This feast is a profound reminder that Christ remains with us in the most intimate and personal way—in the Holy Eucharist. The altar becomes the meeting place where heaven touches earth, and we are nourished with the Bread of Life.

The Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus – Love Beyond Measure: June is also traditionally dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus—a symbol of Christ's immense love for all humanity. This feast reminds us of a heart that beats with divine mercy, forgiveness, and compassion. The Sacred Heart is a refuge for sinners, a source of peace for the weary, and a wellspring of grace for all who seek Him.

A Call to Holiness

Each of these celebrations—Pentecost, Holy Trinity, Corpus Christi, and the Sacred Heart—is not just a liturgical event, but a divine invitation to renew our faith, deepen our devotion, and live with purpose. June offers us a path of holiness, a time to celebrate who God is, what He has done, and how He continues to be present among us.

Let us walk through this sacred month with joy and gratitude. May the Spirit lead us, the Trinity embrace us, the Eucharist nourish us, and the Heart of Jesus transform us.

A Minute with Jesus: The Holy Spirit and the Eucharist | Even after the Apostles had experienced the Risen Christ, they were afraid. They gathered with Mary on the day of Pentecost and prayed behind locked doors, waiting as instructed for the Gift of the Holy Spirit. After the Holy Spirit descended upon them on Pentecost, the Apostles were no longer afraid and were equipped to fulfill their role in bringing others to Jesus and His Church. It is the same for us today. When we receive the Eucharist, we also receive God the Holy Spirit, to abide in the depths of our hearts. If we allow Him, the Spirit of Truth will transform us and we will no longer be afraid, but be equipped with peace and strength for our role in God's plan. Let us then prepare for each Eucharistic encounter in the same way the Apostles prepared for Pentecost, "in prayer ... with Mary ..." (Acts 1:14). Let's pray this right now and every day this week: the sequence for Pentecost Come, Holy Spirit, come! And from Your celestial home shed a ray of light divine! Come, Father of the poor! Come, source of all our store! Come, within our bosoms shine. You, of comforters the best; You, the soul's most welcome guest; Sweet refreshment here below; In our labor, rest most sweet; Grateful coolness in the heat; Solace in the midst of woe. O most blessed Light divine, shine within these hearts of Yours, and our inmost being fill! Where You are not, we have naught, nothing good in deed or thought, nothing free from taint of ill. Heal our wounds, our strength renew; On our dryness pour Your dew; Wash the stains of guilt away: Bend the stubborn heart and will; Melt the frozen, warm the chill; Guide the steps that go astray. On the faithful, who adore and confess You evermore, In your sevenfold gift descend; Give them virtue's sure reward; Give them your salvation, Lord; Give them joys that never end. Amen. Alleluia.

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ - June 22, 2025

The annual Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (also called Corpus Christi, "Body of Christ") finds many parishes around the world celebrating a procession in which a host consecrated at Mass is then carried in a monstrance in a solemn way through a city's streets—June 22, 2025. The Corpus Christi procession is an occasion to profess our faith in the Sacrament of the Eucharist, to thank Jesus for the gift of His cross and presence in this Sacrament—and to walk with Him toward the Promised Land of Heaven.



Stewardship Bulletin Reflection June 8, 2025 - Pentecost Sunday - Mass during the Day ACTS 1:1-11; PS 104:1, 24, 29-30, 31, 34; 1 COR 12:3B-7, 12-13or ROM 8:8 -17; JN 20:19-23 or JN 14:15-16, 23B-26 Today, as we culminate the Easter season

with the grand Feast of Pentecost, let's take a moment to reflect on the personal significance of this day. The readings of today's celebration fill us with awe as we witness the mighty power of the Holy Spirit at work, giving birth to and sustaining our Church. This same Spirit is reaching out to each one of us, individually, on this day, calling us to play our unique role in the Church's mission. You are not just a part of the crowd, but a significant individual in this divine plan. In the first reading from Acts, we see the creative genius of the Holy Spirit at work through the newly confirmed Apostles, who began to speak in different languages as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim the gospel. The large crowd, gathered from all over the world, was amazed and astounded that each person could understand the Apostles speaking in their language. Each one of us, regardless of age, is personally called today by the Holy Spirit into the same mission as that of the first Apostles — to advance the Kingdom of God in our corner of the world. This personal call from the Holy Spirit makes each of us feel individually addressed and important. Just as He did on that Pentecost day, the Holy Spirit speaks to us in our "own language" to give us the Good News of the Gospel and urge us to share it. We can think of our language as the gifts, talents, and passions we possess. We experience the presence of the Holy Spirit through them, and we are meant to put them to work in grateful service of the Kingdom of God. When we think about the stewardship way of life, we often focus on the challenges it presents. Surrendering ourselves to God is indeed a challenging way to live. However, it leads to a life that is not only challenging but also exciting, creative, and deeply rewarding. Stewardship enables us to experience life as a great adventure because it is a life guided and directed by the very source of power and creativity—the Holy Spirit. This emphasis on the excitement and creativity of stewardship should inspire and motivate us in our mission.
