



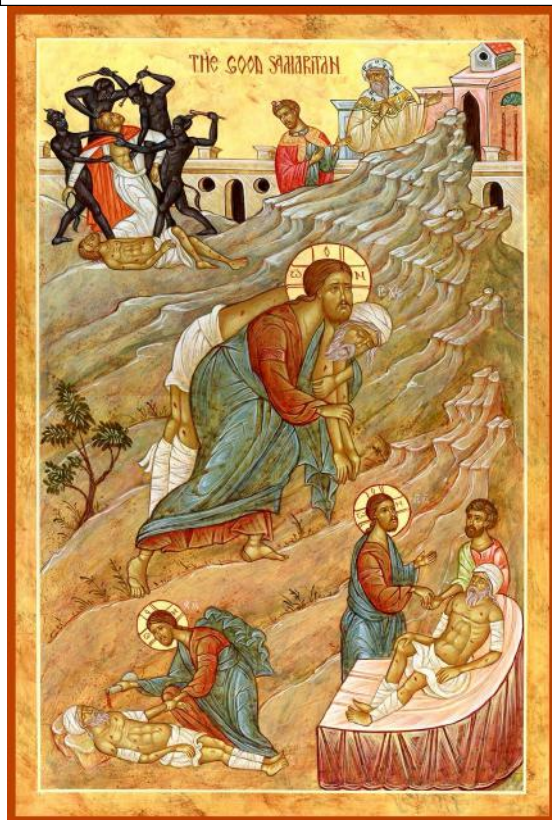

It begins with the Apostles’ Creed, which summarizes the great mysteries of our Catholic faith. The Our Father, which introduces each mystery, is from the Gospels. The first part of the Hail Mary is the angel’s words announcing Christ’s birth and Elizabeth’s greeting to Mary and the second part is asking Mary to pray for us. The Mysteries of the Rosary center on the events of Christ’s life. The repetition in the Rosary is meant to lead us into restful prayer, providing guidance to situations that we face. The gentle repetition of the words helps us to enter into the silence of our hearts, where Jesus dwells. **Stewardship Bulletin Reflection July 13, 2025 - Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time DT 30:10-14; PS 69:14,17,30-31, 33-34, 36, 37 or PS 19:8-11; COL 1:15-20; LK 10: 25-37**

In today's Gospel passage from Luke, we read the well-known parable of the Good Samaritan. Here, Jesus teaches us in rich detail what stewardship in action looks like. This parable could just as accurately be called the parable of the Good Steward. The first thing we note about the Good Samaritan is that he is aware of the needs of those around him and responds generously. While the priest and Levite brush right past the man on the side of the road, the Samaritan is attentive to those who might need help. He has a hospitable way of viewing the world around him, enabling him to "see" in a way that the others did not, and he was "moved with compassion at the sight" of the man. Next, we see the Good Samaritan spring into action to help this man, setting aside his schedule and plans to address his needs. He doesn't just hand the man a few dollars or offer quick words of encouragement from across the road. He approaches the man directly, cleans and bandages his wounds, puts him on his animal, and takes him to an inn where he can recover. He ensures that the innkeeper will continue to care for him and commits to returning to the man on his way back. That is how we fulfill God's commandments. That exemplifies genuine hospitality and service. That is how a good steward springs into action upon encountering a neighbor in need. And Jesus says to each of us, just as He did in today's Gospel, "Go and do likewise."
