A Message from Fr. Cryton,

July – The Month of Ministries – The Ministry of Lector

Dear Parishioners,

As we dedicate the month of July to highlighting and strengthening our liturgical ministries at St. Mary's, we begin with one of the most vital and spiritually enriching ministries in our Church—the Ministry of the Lector.

What Is the Role of a Lector?

The Lector is the one who proclaims the Word of God at Mass. This is not simply a public reading, but a sacred proclamation. When the Scriptures are read in the assembly, God Himself speaks to His people. The lector becomes the vessel through which God's Word is made alive, meaningful, and powerful in the hearts of those who hear it. As the General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) tells us: "When the Sacred Scriptures are read in the Church, God Himself speaks to His people, and Christ, present in His own word, proclaims the Gospel."

Why Is Lectoring Important?

It Deepens the Faith of the Community: The first encounter many parishioners have with the message of the day's Mass is through the readings. A lector who prepares prayerfully and reads with clarity and reverence helps open hearts to God's message.

It Forms the Lector Spiritually: Serving as a lector is not just a public function—it is a spiritual discipline. Those who proclaim the Word often find that it transforms them first. The Word shapes your own heart before it ever reaches the assembly.

It Strengthens the Worship of the Church: The Liturgy of the Word is a central part of our Eucharistic celebration. When done well, it uplifts the entire Mass and helps prepare the faithful to receive the Eucharist with greater understanding and devotion.

Who Can Be a Lector?

At St. Mary's, we welcome adults, young adults, and confirmed high school students who have a love for Scripture and a desire to serve. No formal theological training is required—just a heart willing to serve, a commitment to preparation, and a voice to proclaim. We provide guidance for all new lectors to ensure that they feel confident and prepared to serve with grace and reverence.

An Invitation to Serve

If you feel called to proclaim the Word of God, we invite you to become part of the Lector Ministry at St. Mary's. Whether you are a seasoned reader or someone considering this ministry for the first time, this is a beautiful way to offer your gifts to God and to the parish community.

This month, as we renew and recommit to our liturgical ministries, consider this a personal invitation. Come, lend your voice to God's Word—become a bearer of His message of hope, mercy, and life.

Sign up sheets are available in the church or contact the parish office or speak to Fr. Cryton or Deacon Tom after Mass.

Let us build a Church that listens to the Word and lives by it.

Prayer Changes Things: Let Us Pray for Peace | Will you gather your family for 10 minutes a day to pray one Decade of the Rosary? The Rosary is a Scripture-based prayer. It begins with the Apostles' Creed, which summarizes the great mysteries of our Catholic faith. The Our Father, which introduces each mystery, is from the Gospels. The first part of the Hail Mary is the angel's words announcing Christ's birth and Elizabeth's greeting to Mary and the second part is asking Mary to pray for us. The Mysteries of the Rosary center on the events of Christ's life. The repetition in the Rosary is meant to lead us into restful prayer, providing guidance to situations that we face. The gentle repetition of the words helps us to enter into the silence of our hearts, where Jesus dwells. 



Time IS 66:10-14C; PS 66:1-7, 16, 20; GAL 6: 14-18; LK 10:1-12, 17-20 In today's Gospel passage from Luke, we find our Lord appointing disciples to go out and prepare others to receive His invitation into the Kingdom of God. Every verse offers guidance on how a Christian steward should approach others. Let's examine at least one of the coaching tips Christ provides. "The Lord appointed seventy-two others whom He sent out ahead of Him in pairs to every town and place He intended to visit." In His wisdom, Christ sent His disciples out not as individuals, but in pairs, forming teams. This approach to evangelization not only offered practical advantages but also fostered a sense of unity and shared mission. The disciples could rely on each other for mutual support and encouragement, helping one another stay focused and collaborate in prayer and problemsolving. This teamwork approach remains just as relevant for us, modern-day Christian stewards. It takes courage and commitment to invite others into the Christian life. We need to work together to do it effectively, and in doing so, we can inspire and motivate one another. But there is also symbolic importance in working as a team. It highlights the reality that when we invite others to embrace the Good News of the Gospel, we are not merely inviting them into a belief system, but into a relationship with Christ and, through that relationship, into Christ's family — our fellow Christian disciples near and far. Our parish is our immediate spiritual family in this vast worldwide community. We are not meant to live as isolated individuals within the parish any more than we are meant to live in isolation within our families. We are called to be a community, one that is supportive and welcoming, offering reassurance and comfort. This is why it is essential to cultivate a vibrant, welcoming parish life. We emphasize hospitality as one of the pillars of stewardship. It is not enough to point others to Christ; we must also invite them to join us in community with Him, providing a place and a mission for them within the Church and our parish family.
