Stewardship Bulletin Reflection August 24, 2025 -Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time IS 66:18-21; PS 117: 1-2; HEB 12:5-7, 11-13; LK 13:22-30 Today's readings remind us that merely calling ourselves Christ's disciples isn't enough. To be genuine followers, we must live for Christ every day and in every part of our lives. This kind of life requires strength and discipline. Intentionally and consistently offering the Lord the best of our Time, Talent, and Treasure through a stewardship lifestyle is a form of spiritual discipline. Stewardship, which involves managing and sharing our resources in a way that honors God, is a key spiritual discipline. These spiritual disciplines teach us to become increasingly aware of God's constant provision for us, and they keep us on the narrow path that leads to the Kingdom of Heaven. The more we embrace this way of life, the more we can be "trained" by the Lord in the ways of true discipleship. Though difficult, these disciplines become a source of spiritual strength. Our Lord Himself talks about the challenging path to the Kingdom of Heaven in today's Gospel reading from Luke. He is asked, "Lord, will only a few be saved?" Jesus replies, "Strive to enter through the narrow gate, for many, I tell you, will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough." This narrow

path, though difficult, is the path of true discipleship. Attending Mass on Sunday while living as if Christ is an afterthought the rest of the week does not make us disciples. Moreover, this attitude toward our faith is an unfair and unloving response to our good God, who has given us everything we have and are. Jesus does not want us to go through the motions of faith merely. He wants much more from us and for us. He desires a deep, personal relationship with each of us, inviting us to become His holy disciples. This is not a burden; it is a privilege. However, it does require discipline —the discipline of a stewardship way of life.

Take a Minute to Get to Know "the God of All Hope" (Rom 15:13) | In the Book of Genesis, when Adam and Eve were tempted by the devil, they let their trust in their Creator die in their heart and, abusing their freedom to do good, they disobeyed God's command. All personal sin committed subsequently is disobedience toward God and lack of trust in His goodness. God is perfect goodness and only wants what is best for us. After this Original Sin, God did not stop loving our first parents, as shown through His promise of a Savior who would rescue us from the consequence of being separated from our Heavenly Father. The promise was kept as Jesus came to rescue us from Satan, sin and eternal death. Let us ask Jesus to strengthen the gift of hope in us, to trust in His goodness.
