Mission COOP program for the Diocese of Moroto, in Uganda: August 9th & 10th

Moroto Diocese is situated in the North-Eastern part of Uganda, in the semi-desert region of Karamoja, bordering southern Sudan and Northern Kenya. It is the least developed and poorest region in Uganda with problems of insecurity, harsh climate conditions, famine, poverty, illiteracy, and very poor infrastructure.

The diocese has a population of about 450,000 people, of which 45% are Catholics. We are seeking help from you, our sisters and brothers, so that we can carry out the work of evangelization, proclaim the good news and sanctify God's people. Your contributions will be used by my bishop in the following areas: support rural apostolate by empowering and facilitating evangelizing ministers, support to war victims, orphans, the aged, HIV/AIDs patients/families, widows and widowers, support youth ministry, support catholic education and schools, and support catholic founded hospitals.

I know you are going through hard economic times, and we continue to pray for God's support to us all. Whatever little you offer- \$10, \$5 or \$20, means a lot and will provide a change for the people in my diocese. We are deeply grateful for any assistance.

Stewardship Bulletin Reflection August 3, 2025 - Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time ECC 1:2, 2:21-23; PS 90:3-6, 12-13, 17; COL 3: 1-5, 9-11; LK 12:13-21 Today's Gospel offers encouragement

from Heaven for those living as faithful stewards. It reminds us of our reasons for choosing this way of life. Admittedly, some may see our focus on serving God and others as foolish, but God's opinion matters most. Spoiler: Christian stewards are not foolish! God affirms your choices, showing they hold great value. In this passage, Jesus makes it clear that life isn't about "stuff," as he illustrates with the parable of the wealthy businessman who thought he had everything under control. The man had so much stuff that he didn't have space to store it all. So, focusing only on earthly possessions and not on what is above, he decided to build a bigger storage place. Patting himself on the back, he thought about the good times he would enjoy in the years to come. But Jesus tells us that the day would turn out to be the man's last on earth. And he had spent it thinking only of himself. How foolish! Don't be ashamed of choosing a different way of life from those around you. Be confident as you prioritize what is above. You are wise in God's eyes, a faithful steward. And you will be rich in what matters most, gaining spiritual wealth and fulfillment beyond material possessions.
