



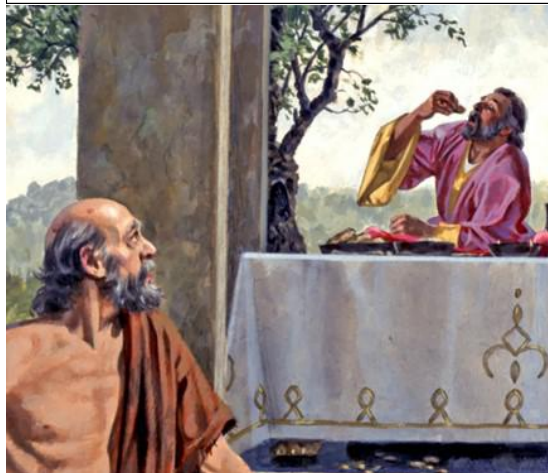

A Message from Fr. Cryton,

How the Archangels Inspire and Strengthen Our Christian Faith (The Feast of Saints Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael- September 29th)

We celebrate the Feast of Saints Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael, the three archangels who serve as powerful witnesses to God's love and protection in our lives. These heavenly messengers offer us profound lessons in faith, courage, and trust that can transform our daily Christian journey.

Saint Michael the Archangel stands as our defender and protector, reminding us that no matter how overwhelming life's battles may seem, God's power is greater than any force that opposes us. When we face temptation, fear, or spiritual warfare, Michael's example teaches us to stand firm in our faith, knowing that Christ has already won the victory. His famous battle cry, "Who is like God?" challenges us to surrender our pride and trust completely in divine providence.

Saint Gabriel the Archangel, the messenger of God's will, shows us the beauty of saying "yes" to God's plan, even when we don't fully understand it. Just as he announced the Incarnation to Mary, Gabriel reminds us that God continues to speak to us today through Scripture, prayer, and the circumstances of our lives. His presence encourages us to listen with open hearts and respond with faith-filled obedience.

Saint Raphael the Archangel, whose name means "God heals," walks alongside us as our companion and guide. Like Tobias in the Book of Tobit, we are never alone on our journey. Raphael's healing presence reminds us that God desires our wholeness in body, mind, and spirit. He encourages us to trust in God's providence, especially during times of uncertainty and transition.

These three archangels strengthen our Christian faith by showing us that heaven is not distant from earth, but intimately connected to our daily lives. They remind us that we are surrounded by God's love and protection, called to faithful discipleship, and invited into the healing embrace of divine mercy.

As we honor these mighty archangels, let us ask for their intercession in our own lives. May Saint Michael defend us from evil, may Saint Gabriel help us hear and respond to God's voice, and may Saint Raphael guide and heal us on our journey to eternal life.

Stewardship Bulletin Reflection September 28, 2025 - Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time AM 6:1A, 4-7; PS 146:7-10;1 TM 6:11-16; LK 16:19-31 We have all been given great power by God in the form of Time, Talents, and Treasure.

Today's readings remind us that this power is meant to be used for good. And that failing to do so has eternal consequences. We recognize the urgency of using our gifts wisely, as highlighted in today's Gospel passage from Luke. Our Lord shares the powerful parable of the rich man who neglects poor Lazarus during their lives. At the moment of the rich man's death, he descends to the netherworld, while Lazarus is taken to eternal joy and comfort in the bosom of Abraham. The rich man deeply regrets his neglect of Lazarus's needs, but it is too late for regret. His actions have unfolded, and now he must face the consequences of not using the gifts God provided. This parable also reassures us that living a stewardship way of life brings joy and comfort in this life and the next. Pursuing God's kingdom and caring for the poor are not trivial matters. Our Lord clearly emphasizes this repeatedly in the Scriptures and through the ongoing teachings of our 2,000-year-old Church. We are free to ignore these teachings and live for ourselves instead. However, there will be tragic consequences for us in the end. Since we are meant for eternity, living selfishly on this earth doesn't truly bring us lasting happiness. So, how can we use our great powers for good? By embracing a stewardship way of life. By putting God first in all areas of our lives — in how we spend our time, how we share our talents, and how we give of our financial resources. Stewardship living challenges us to step out of our comfort zones and into commitment to the Lord and what matters to Him.

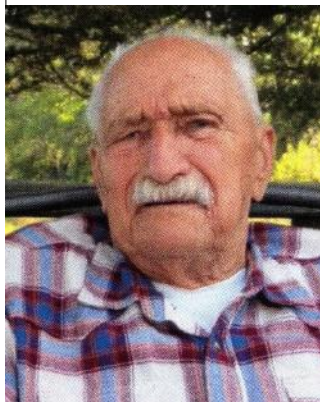
Jesus is Our Hope (1 Tim 1:1) | God created you out of love. He knows and loves
