Two New Saints Declared in the Catholic Church by Pope Leo XIV this Sunday, September 7th!



Carlo Acutis will be the first millennial Saint declared in the Catholic Church! He was born in London in 1991 and grew up in Milan, Italy. At the age of seven, he developed a deep devotion to the Eucharist, describing it as "my highway to Heaven." He attended Mass daily, went to confession regularly, and prayed the rosary. Passionate about technology, he taught himself programming and web design, using those skills to evangelize. He created the famous exhibition on Eucharistic miracles (136 documented cases) which continues to travel the world today, a global project he launched before his death in 2006 at the age of 15 from leukemia.

Beyond technology, Carlo lived a faith rooted in everyday life. He went to confession frequently, helped classmates in need, and took part in pilgrimages to Lourdes and Fatima. During his vacations, he dedicated time to volunteering, and in his later years, he designed

a website for his parish to share catechetical materials and promote parish activities.

Beatified in 2020 thanks to a miracle in Brazil, a second miracle, the healing of a young Costa Rican woman after a serious accident, was confirmed in 2024, paving his way to the altars. His canonization was announced by Pope Leo XIV during his first public consistory.

A couple quotes from Saint Carlo Acutis: "The Eucharist is the highway to heaven." "Sadness is looking at ourselves, happiness is looking towards God." "Do not be afraid because with the Incarnation of Jesus, death becomes life, and there's no need to escape: in eternal life, something extraordinary awaits us."



Pier Giorgio Frassati -- In an age where faith is often lived quietly, Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati stands as a vibrant witness that holiness can be young, joyful, and alive in the world. Born on April 6, 1901, in Turin, Italy. Despite his privileged upbringing, he directed his life toward the poor and toward God, never letting wealth or status distract him from the call of the Gospel. From his youth, Pier Giorgio was deeply devoted to prayer and the sacraments. He attended daily Mass, prayed the Rosary with love, and spent time in Eucharistic Adoration. His faith was not hidden, he joined Catholic Action, was active in the St. Vincent de Paul Society, and became a Third Order Dominican, taking to heart the call to seek holiness in daily life. His personal motto, "Verso l'Alto" ("To the Heights"), captured both his love of mountain climbing and his spiritual pursuit of heaven.

Pier Giorgio's friends knew him as a man of joy and courage. He organized hikes, skied, laughed, and played pranks, but he was also a tireless servant of the poor. He visited the sick, delivered food and

medicine, and paid rent for struggling families, often keeping his acts of charity hidden from even those closest to him.

His life was brief but radiant. At just 24 years old, Pier Giorgio contracted polio, likely from ministering to the sick, and died on July 4, 1925. At his funeral, Turin's streets were filled with thousands of mourners — many of them the poor he had served quietly and faithfully.

In 1990, Pope St. John Paul II beatified Pier Giorgio, calling him the "Man of the Eight Beatitudes" and offering him as a model for young people and lay Catholics seeking to live their faith with courage.

Stewardship Bulletin Reflection September 7, 2025 - Twenty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time WIS 9:13-18B; PS 90:3-6,12-14, 17; PHMN 9-10, 12-17; LK 14:25-33

Today's readings clearly show the demands placed on those who want to be called disciples of Christ. We must be ready to give our all to Him. But ultimately, the life of discipleship — this stewardship way of living — is the only life that can truly satisfy.

In the Gospel passage from Luke, Christ says, "If anyone comes to me without hating his father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple." Our Lord is not speaking of feelings but rather of priorities. He must come first in every part of our lives. Period.

He continues. "Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple." In other words, it's all or nothing. Compromise simply isn't an option. Christ wants us to give all of ourselves—our personal lives, our family, our parish—to Him and to the pursuit of His kingdom.

And just when we think our Lord might soften His message to make it easier to accept, He goes even further! "Anyone of you who does not renounce all his possessions cannot be my disciple." Why is our Lord so demanding? Only because He knows us deeply and loves us immensely.

He knows that if we don't prioritize Him above all, we'll be easily overwhelmed by earthly concerns — our material things, our status, and our egos. He understands these things cannot truly satisfy us. He knows this because He is our Creator, and He made us for more.

We are created to be His disciples, to seek after Him and His Kingdom. Embracing stewardship as a way of life helps us to recognize the cost and then pursue Him with all our strength.

Another promise that God made to Abraham was that He would make his name great. (Gen 12:2) This promise was kept through King David who was a man after God's own heart. David faithfully submitted to the will of God, was fervent in his prayer, including the writing of the psalms and humbly repented when his sin was pointed out to Him. His prayer was a faithful adherence to the divine promise and expressed a loving and joyful trust in God, the only King and Lord. God fulfilled His promise as He blessed David's efforts to unite the Holy Land to be a great nation while making David's name great. Let us ask Jesus to deepen our loving and joyful trust in God – the promise keeper – during this Jubilee Year of Hope 2025.


